Description:

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to Opus One Solutions (USA) Corporation (Opus USA) to design, develop and demonstrate an integrated system.

DOE completed a NEPA Determination for this project on August 10, 2017 (GFO-0008010-001, CX A9, B3.6). At that time, Advanced Microgrid Solutions (AMS) was the prime recipient. The award was later novated to Opus USA. DOE completed a second NEPA Determination on July 25, 2018 (GFO-0008010-002, CX A9, B3.6), which reviewed the novated project. Since that time, Opus USA's original utility partner, Georgetown Utility Services (GUS), has been replaced by Commonwealth Edison (ComEd). Field demonstration activities that were originally proposed to be performed at facilities operated by GUS would instead be performed at a demonstration site operated by ComEd.

A site has not yet been selected for field demonstration activities. A meaningful NEPA review assessing potential impacts cannot be conducted until a site has been identified. Accordingly, DOE is restricting all field demonstration activities for this award. These activities will be reviewed once a site has been selected and all applicable information has been submitted to DOE for review. Opus USA is authorized to complete all other project activities, which remain unchanged from previous reviews.

FOR CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION DETERMINATIONS

This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.
