Summary of Meeting:

About the MHI

- MHI is the only national trade association that represents all segments of the factory-built housing industry.
- Our members include homebuilders, suppliers, retail sellers, lenders, installers, community owners and operators, and others who serve the industry. We also have 48 affiliated state organizations.
- In 2020 the industry shipped almost 95,000 HUD Code homes produced by 33 U.S. corporations in 137 plants located across the country.
- MHI members are responsible for close to 85 percent of the manufactured homes produced each year.
- Manufactured Housing is Poised to Help Address Nation’s Affordable Housing Needs
- MHI and its Members Support Energy Efficiency
- MHI and its Members have Serious Concerns with Proposed Rule
- International Energy Conservation Code is NOT Appropriate Code for Manufactured Housing
- MHI and its Members have Serious Concerns About the Feasibility of the Proposed Changes
- The HUD Code is the ONLY Appropriate Code to Update Energy Efficiency Standards for Manufactured Housing
- DOE and HUD Must Work Together to Develop Manufactured Housing Energy Efficiency Standards
