Pick a Spot

Visit the Weldon Spring Site and spend time in its native plant garden or the Howell Prairie. Find a good spot with numerous plants of varying heights and shapes.

Observe

Look for landscapes displaying various brown colors in plants and on the ground. Observe the foreground, midground, and background, looking closely for texture and shadows.

Identify different brown shades

Match the brown tones in your palette with what you see in the landscape. Note how light and darkness intermingle to change the look and feel of your surroundings.

Create


Paint or color what you see. Can you see more yellow or red in those specific shades? Add different colors to better match the shades you see. For more accents, try adding black and white.
