WEATHERIZATION PROGRAM NOTICE 21-2 ISSUED DATE: January 21, 2021

SUBJECT: PROGRAM YEAR 2021 GRANTEE ALLOCATIONS

INTENDED AUDIENCE: Weatherization Grantee Managers, Weatherization Subgrantee Managers

PURPOSE: To provide Grantee allocations for the preparation and submission of applications for funding of the Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) for Program Year (PY) 2021.

SCOPE: The provisions of this guidance apply to all Grantees applying for financial assistance under the Department of Energy (DOE) WAP.

LEGAL AUTHORITY: Title IV, Energy Conservation and Production Act, as amended, authorizes DOE to administer the WAP (42 U.S.C. § 6861 *et seq.*). All grant awards made under this program shall comply with applicable law and regulations including the WAP Regulations contained in 10 CFR Part 440.

PROCEDURES: On December 27, 2020, the President signed P.L. 116-260, which provides fiscal year (FY) 2021 full-year appropriations through September 30, 2021. Under this Act the WAP was appropriated \$310,000,000, to include \$18,600,000 to be made available to current WAP grant recipients via the Weatherization Innovation Pilot Program (WIPP) for innovation and \$1,000,000 to develop and implement strategies to treat harmful substances, including vermiculite. An additional \$5,000,000 was appropriated for training and technical assistance (T&TA) activities at Headquarters. Additional information with regard to WIPP opportunities will be issued at a later date.

At this appropriation level, the Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007 (EISA) authorizes the Secretary of Energy to make funding available for Sustainable Energy Resources for Consumers (SERC) Grants. DOE will reduce the amount being distributed to the Grantees by \$6,200,000 for Fiscal Year (FY) 2021. This is in addition to the \$6,100,000 set aside in FY 2020. DOE will send out instructions on SERC funding opportunity under a separate memo. Once the Secretary determines how much, if any, will be distributed under SERC, any remaining funds not used for SERC will be distributed through formula.

Total funds being made available to Grantees for distribution through the formula in FY 2021 is \$283,375,000.

The final Grantee allocations included in this Notice are to be used in conjunction with Weatherization Program Notice (WPN) 21-1 entitled Program Year 2021 Weatherization Grant Application, with its two attachments: 1) Administrative and Legal Requirements Document; and 2) Application Instructions, in developing the annual Grant application for PY 2021. In addition, please refer to WAP Memorandum 075, Weatherization Assistance Program Reauthorization Impacts for State Plan Submission.
