Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Description:

B5.16 Solar photovoltaic systems

The installation, modification, operation, and removal of commercially available solar photovoltaic systems located on a building or other structure (such as rooftop, parking lot or facility, and mounted to signage, lighting, gates, or fences), or if located on land, generally comprising less than 10 acres within a previously disturbed or developed area. Covered actions would be in accordance with applicable requirements (such as local land use and zoning requirements) in the proposed project area and would incorporate appropriate control technologies and best management practices.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to the New Hampshire Office of Strategic Initiatives to provide a loan to the NH Community Development Finance Authority (CDFA) to install a 198-kW solar photovoltaic (PV) ground mounted system located at Amherst Country Club, in Amherst, NH. The project would supply electricity for all operations at the Country Club.

The proposed PV array would consist of 494 modules, six inverters with optimizers and the associated racking system. The site would require minor grading. A swimming pool was originally located at the site but was removed a few years ago and has since been used to store equipment and materials. A total of 40 - 3 diameter holes would be dug 6' deep for the pole foundations supporting the solar racking structure. In addition, a temporary trench up to 2' wide and approximately 265' long would be dug to connect the 5 rows with PV conduit which would then connect to the inverters. All trenches would be refilled and landscaped to grade. The total area for the solar array would be 8,680 ft sg. Existing roads would be used to access the project location. The solar array would have two connections to the grid with two meters. One meter would be used primarily for the cart shed; the other meter would be used for the clubhouse. The utility line and the utility pad-mounted transformer would require upgrades to accommodate the PV array connection.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) Endangered Species Program website (IPaC) lists the threatened Northern Long-eared Bat (NLEB) as possibly occurring within the project area. Tree removal at the project site could affect the NLEB, if present. Tree removal activities are planned to occur outside of the pup season from June 1 – July 31 to prevent impacts to NLEB from removal or disturbance of maternity roost trees. Based on the above, DOE completed a streamlined Section 7 consultation with USFWS for NLEB. DOE determined that this project may affect the NLEB but that any resulting incidental take of the NLEB is not prohibited by the final 4(d) rule for the species.

The recipient worked directly with their State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) to ensure protection of cultural resources during the project activities. The SHPO reviewed the proposed project activities and the site location, and determined, "No Historic Properties Effected" on January 11, 2021. DOE is in agreement with this determination from the New Hampshire SHPO.

The proposed project is located within the 100-year floodplain. After evaluation of the potential impacts, DOE has determined that the buried electrical lines and the addition of the poles for the PV foundations would not have shortterm or long-term adverse impacts to the floodplain. Additionally, DOE has determined that the project activities are not subject to the preparation and distribution of a notice of floodplain action as required under Subpart B of 10 CFR 1022 "Compliance with Floodplain and Wetland Environmental Review Requirements", as the project is a minor modification of an existing facility to improve environmental conditions and the requirement is not applicable (10 CFR 1022.5(d)(3)).

Some of the soils in the project areas are considered prime farmland if protected from flooding or not frequently flooded during the growing season, but the land has already been heavily disturbed for human use (i.e. buildings, an area where a swimming pool was once located but has since been filled in with dirt, and a parking lot) and therefore there would be no conversion of protected farmlands to non-agricultural use as a result of the DOE funded project.

DOE also conducted a review of potential issues relating to other resources of concern and found that no effects would be expected to result from the proposed project activities.

NEPA PROVISION

DOE has made a final NEPA determination.

Include the following condition in the financial assisstance agreement:

Recipient must complete project tree removal activities outside of June 1 – July 31, for protection of the Northern Longeared Bat.

All electronic components of the solar photovoltaic panels must be installed above the base flood elevation in the 100-year floodplain.

FOR CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION DETERMINATIONS

The proposed action (or the part of the proposal defined in the Rationale above) fits within a class of actions that is listed in Appendix A or B to 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D. There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposed action that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposed action has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

The proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
