Overall BSRA Subjective Performance Review for FY 2021

BSRA’s noteworthy positive performance for the period included:

- Remained the complex's safest National Laboratory with over 7 million hours (Total Recordable Case Rate), over 7.6 million hours (DART - Days Away), and over 18.6 million hours (DART - Restricted).
- Timely and high-quality support to the Nuclear Materials Management, Liquid High-Level Waste Disposition, Environmental Remediation and Infrastructure Disposition, U.S. Intelligence Community, Secure Energy and Manufacturing, and Nuclear Fuel Cycle missions.
- Excellent program management and technical leadership/direction for the Minority Serving Institutions Partnership Program.
- Effectively executed role as the DOE-EM National Laboratory through the execution of SRNL's role in the EM National Laboratory Governance Framework.
- Active participation in the Network of National Labs as part of the National Lab Directors Council and its working groups.
- Continued advancement of the research portfolio, specific to core competencies (i.e., cyber security, robotics and remote systems, artificial intelligence, smart manufacturing, and biotechnologies).
- Successful recruitment and onboarding (i.e., virtual LabSYNC SRNL orientation) of 125 staff members even with challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Excellence in maintaining and renewing facility and infrastructure portfolio through numerous laboratory renovations.
- Excellent support to DOE for the development of the Advanced Manufacturing Collaborative design.

There were three areas of improvement noted during the evaluation period.

- Contractor Assurance - opportunities to improve the quality of Issue Reviews and Fact Findings, specifically the gathering of all issue facts to ensure an effective identification of corrective actions to prevent recurrence.
- Delays in the National Nuclear Material Archive (NNMA) item identifications were impacted resulting in NNMA nominations being behind pace and milestones being extended into FY 2022.
- Implementation of Rev. 2 of the SRNL DSA/TSR has experienced unexpected delays that BSRA is attempting to mitigate.
