Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) Transition

January 18, 2022



Background

Starting on April 4, 2022, the federal government will stop using the DUNS number to uniquely identify entities doing business with the federal government. Any entity will need to use a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) that is created in SAM.gov (SAM).

- The change impacts Grantees and Subgrantees.
- Any Grantee or Subgrantee already registered in SAM.gov has been assigned a UEI.



Background

Today

The authoritative unique entity identifier used by the federal government is the DUNS Number.


- The DUNS is a 9-character numeric value.
- Managed, granted and owned by a third-party provider (Dun and Bradstreet).


April 4, 2022

The authoritative unique entity identifier used by the federal government will be the Unique Entity Identifier (UEI).

- The UEI is a 12-character alphanumeric value.
- Managed, granted and owned by the federal government through SAM.gov.


Background

- This transition from DUNS to UEI will remove a thirdparty provider from the identification process and allow the federal government to streamline the entity identification and validation process.
- The change will make it less burdensome for anyone to do business with the federal government.
- All systems will need to have the transition complete no later than April 4, 2022, when the federal system will be using the new UEI in their systems.




SAM.gov

- The UEI is viewable in SAM.gov in different locations:
 - 1. Displayed in search results.



SAM.gov

- The UEI is viewable in SAM.gov in different locations:
 - 2. Located below the DUNS number on the entity registration record.



SAM.gov

- Any Grantee or Subgrantee registered in SAM.gov today already has a UEI.
 - This includes inactive registrations.
- If Grantees or Subgrantees are not registered in SAM.gov, then a full registration approval process could take up to 10 business days to process.
 - Until April 4th, any new entity will need to complete full registration in SAM.gov and continue to obtain a DUNS.



April 1 Grantees

- Will be required to use their DUNS number.
- It is suggested to enter the UEI in the field provided.




July 1 Grantees

Will be required to use the UEI to submit any WAP applications.
