ORDER GRANTING REQUEST TO AMEND AUTHORIZATION TO IMPORT AND EXPORT NATURAL GAS FROM AND TO CANADA TO REFLECT CORPORATE NAME CHANGE

DOE/FECM ORDER NO. 4621-A

On November 4, 2020, the Office of Fossil Energy and Carbon Management (FECM) of the Department of Energy (DOE) issued DOE/FE Order No. 4621 (Docket No. 20-142-NG), under section 3 of the Natural Gas Act (NGA).¹ That order granted the entity known at the time as Exelon Generation Company, LLC (Exelon Generation Company) authorization to import and export a combined total of 350 billion cubic feet of natural gas from and to Canada by pipeline, for a two-year term that began on February 1, 2021, and extends through January 31, 2023.

On January 19, 2022, DOE was notified that Exelon Generation Company's corporate name would be changed to "Constellation Energy Generation, LLC" (Constellation Energy Generation), effective February 1, 2022. Constellation Energy Generation states that this is only a company name change.²

DOE finds that Constellation Energy Generation's request to amend the specified authorization to reflect its corporate name change is consistent with the public interest, pursuant to NGA section 3.

ORDER

Pursuant to section 3 of the Natural Gas Act, it is ordered that:

A. The name of the authorization holder of DOE/FE Order No. 4621 is amended to Constellation Energy Generation, LLC.

B. All obligations arising under DOE/FE Order No. 4621 no longer apply to Exelon Generation Company, LLC, and now apply to Constellation Energy Generation, LLC.
