AUTHORITY</p> <p>What specific authorities authorize this system or project, and the associated collection, use, and/or retention of personal information?</p>	<p>Pursuant to the Bonneville Project Act of August 20, 1937, Ch. 720, 50 Stat. 731, as amended, 16 U.S.C. 832 (1977); the Federal Columbia River Transmission System Act of October 18, 1974, (P.L. 93-454), 88 Stat. 1376, 16 U.S.C. 838 (Supp IV); the Department of Energy Organization Act of August 4, 1977, (P.L. 95-91); and the Pacific Northwest Electric Power Planning and Conservation Act of December 5, 1980, (P.L. 96-501).</p>

Data is either collected and managed by BPA Land Records system or is in the public domain collected and managed by the county government.</p>

IMPACT ANALYSIS:</p> <p>How does this project or information system impact privacy?</p>	<p>There is minimal impact to privacy since county parcel data is public record and can be accessed through direct request of the county records.</p> <p>Select BPA employees will have access, through the eGIS mapping interface to county parcel data, provided by the counties, that may include owner names, addresses, phone numbers and Taxlot ID #.</p> <p>Select BPA employees with permission to BPA’s Land Record System can access acquisition owner information through eGIS. Acquisition owner information includes name and phone numbers.</p>
<p>5. SORNs</p> <p>How will the data be retrieved? Can PII be retrieved by an identifier (e.g. name, unique number or symbol)?</p> <p>If yes, explain, and list the identifiers that will be used to retrieve information on the individual.</p>	<p>No county data PII information can be retrieved by an identifier through eGIS.</p> <p>BPA Land Record System owner information can be accessed through BPA Tract IDs which is an internal unique identifier for BPA acquisition agreements. This is only available to personnel with approved access to BPA Land Record System.</p> <p>eGIS allows users (with approved access to BPA Land Record System) to input Tract IDs which are tied to acquisition owner information.</p>

BPA maintains an active log of acquisition date to track vintage of the data. Land Record System data accessed through eGIS is maintained in accordance with the BPA Land Record System maintenance policies.</p>
<p>19. If the information system is operated in more than one site, how will consistent use of the information be ensured at all sites?</p>	<p>Data is accessed from a single resource.</p>

Retention & Disposition

<p>20. What are the retention periods of data in the information system?</p>	<p>County data is kept current in the system and is retained on server backup for a one year period.</p> <p>BPA Land Record System data retention policy is:</p> <p>Data in the system consists of land records and include land acquisition for transmission line facilities, original legal conveyance instruments, title policies, General Counsel’s final opinion, appraisals, and related data. The records designated “Active” as long as the land is in the possession of BPA. Because of the volume of land owned by BPA, these records are reviewed every ten years. At that time, if a particular piece of land is removed from inventory or is no longer maintained by BPA, the record is pulled from the active list of land. Once the land is removed from inventory or is no longer maintained by BPA, the record is disposed of by BPA. These procedures are in accordance with BPA’s records management schedules.</p>
<p>21. What are the procedures for disposition of the data at the end of the retention period?</p>	<p>County parcel data disposed of in accordance with BPA backup retention policies.</p>
<p>ACCESS, SAFEGUARDS & SECURITY</p>	
<p>22. What controls are in place to protect the data from unauthorized access, modification or use?</p>	<p>Access to data through eGIS is limited to approved users in specified active directory roles. System security is documented in the eGIS System Security Plan. (eGIS is a web application, currently it is in Phase 2, release 1, Sept. 2009). Access to data is controlled via Read-Only, pre-defined queries in the application.</p>
<p>23. Who will have access to PII data?</p>	<p>Only approved users in the active directory roles will have read access to the PII.</p>
<p>24. How is access to PII data determined?</p>	<p>Information is restricted to a limited set of PII, name, address, phone #, and lot ID #.</p>
<p>25. Do other information systems share data or have access to the data in the system? If yes, explain.</p>	<p>eGIS is an endpoint. No other system connects to eGIS components that reference PII.</p>

26. For connecting information systems, is there an Interconnection Security Agreement (ISA) or other agreement between System Owners to ensure the privacy of individuals is protected?	Yes, additional security is in place to limit access to BPA Land Record System data through eGIS tools.
27. Who is responsible for ensuring the authorized use of personal information?	BPA performance managers of employees with access to eGIS system. (eGIS is a web application, currently it is in Phase 2, release 1, September 2009)
