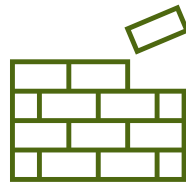

## NEXT STEPS: ENGAGE INTERNAL AND EXTERNAL STAKEHOLDERS

### DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY

Discuss with DOE leadership, including S2, S3, S4 (including laboratories), Weatherization and Intergovernmental Programs Office, LPO, Office of Economic Impact and Diversity, Office of Congressional and Intergovernmental Affairs, and others to be identified how place-based initiatives can be scaled up and out

### ACROSS GOVERNMENT

Identify other agencies (e.g., USDA, HUD, DOT, EPA) to understand importance and successful operations of place-based initiatives

### PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS

Meet with local (e.g., USCOM) and state (e.g., USCA, NGA, NASEO) officials, private sector, and philanthropy (e.g., community-based foundations) to understand needs of place-based initiatives
