

ensure the proper scope of Stabilis’s authorization as described in the body of the Order, DOE is amending Ordering Paragraph A to authorize Stabilis to export LNG in smaller LNG carriers, as well as in approved ISO containers on vessels.⁴

ORDER

Pursuant to section 3 of the Natural Gas Act, it is ordered that:

A. In DOE/FECM Order No. 4863, the second sentence of Ordering Paragraph A is amended to state:

Stabilis is authorized to export this LNG on smaller LNG carriers
and in approved ISO containers on vessels, in a volume equivalent
to 51.75 Bcf/yr of natural gas.

B. All other obligations, rights, and responsibilities established by DOE/FECM Order No. 4863 remain in effect.

⁴ Concurrently with the issuance of the Order, DOE issued a categorical exclusion for the small-scale non-FTA portion of Stabilis’s Application. *See id.* at 6 & n.29 (citing U.S. Dep’t of Energy, Categorical Exclusion Determination, Stabilis GDS, Inc., Docket No. 22-61-LNG (Aug. 23, 2022)). The categorical exclusion referenced all modes of transportation listed above, and therefore DOE finds that no amendment to the categorical exclusion is required.
