DOE/FECM ORDER NO. 4863-A

On August 25, 2022, the Office of Fossil Energy and Carbon Management (FECM) of the Department of Energy (DOE) issued DOE/FECM Order No. 4863 (Order) to Stabilis GDS, Inc. (Stabilis) under section 3 of the Natural Gas Act, 15 U.S.C. § 717b.<sup>1</sup> Under the Order, Stabilis is authorized to export domestically produced liquefied natural gas (LNG) purchased from 39 existing LNG manufacturing facilities in the United States, in a volume equivalent to 51.75 billion cubic feet per year (Bcf/yr) of natural gas.<sup>2</sup>

Ordering Paragraph A of the Order currently authorizes Stabilis “to export this LNG in approved ISO [International Organization for Standardization] containers on vessels ....”<sup>3</sup> To

ensure the proper scope of Stabilis's authorization as described in the body of the Order, DOE is amending Ordering Paragraph A to authorize Stabilis to export LNG in smaller LNG carriers, as well as in approved ISO containers on vessels.<sup>4</sup>

### **ORDER**

Pursuant to section 3 of the Natural Gas Act, it is ordered that:

A. In DOE/FECM Order No. 4863, the second sentence of Ordering Paragraph A is amended to state:

Stabilis is authorized to export this LNG on smaller LNG carriers  
and in approved ISO containers on vessels, in a volume equivalent  
to 51.75 Bcf/yr of natural gas.

B. All other obligations, rights, and responsibilities established by DOE/FECM Order No. 4863 remain in effect.
