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TO THE MEMBERS OF THE NATIONAL PETROLEUM COUNCIL:

Attached is a statement of requirements and firm commitments for the Armed Services bulk petroleum products for the period January-June, 1949.

In total the commitments are 100.1% of the estimated requirements. However, in the case of individual products it will be noted that commitments do not in every case equal or exceed requirement estimates. There are two reasons for this: (1) In some cases purchases in excess of requirements were made during the first half of the fiscal year; (2) in the other cases the requirements have not yet become firm and commitments have been held up pending determination of actual shipping requirements.

It is emphasized that in no case is there any problem for lack of offers on the part of the industry.

Also attached is a statement of estimated requirements for the July-December 1949 period (the January-June 1950 estimated requirements are identical with these figures.) In total, these estimated requirements are 3,778,000 barrels less than in the present period. This represents a decrease of 8.5%. However, aviation requirements are higher by 1,958,000 barrels. These new aviation requirements, while higher than the January-June 1949 period are less grade by grade than the actual amount furnished by the industry in the July-December 1948 period.

Motor gasoline, diesel and Navy Special fuel oil requirements are all lower than at present.

It is the opinion of the Chairman of your Committee and of the Armed Services Petroleum Purchasing Agency that no problem whatever will arise in obtaining these requirements in a normal manner from industry sources.
