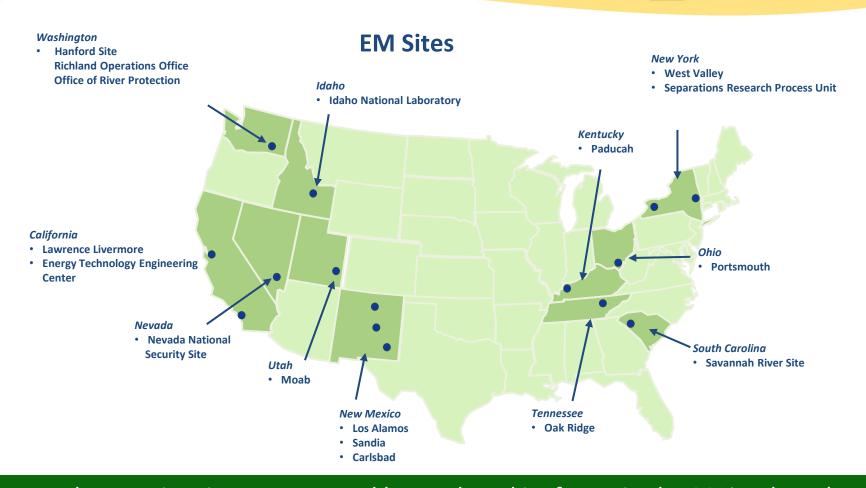

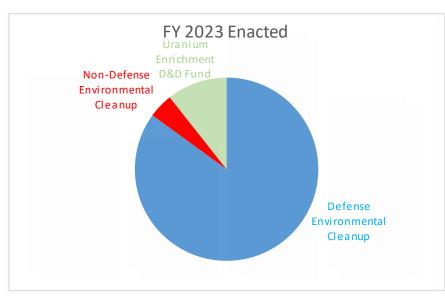
EM Continues Making Cleanup Progress

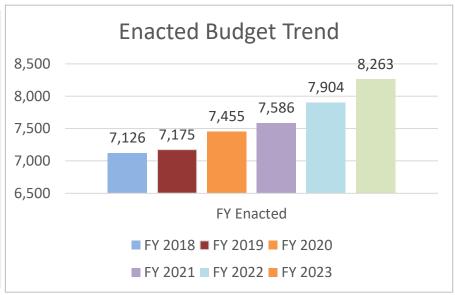


EM has 15 sites in 11 states and has reduced its footprint by 90% to less than 300 square miles

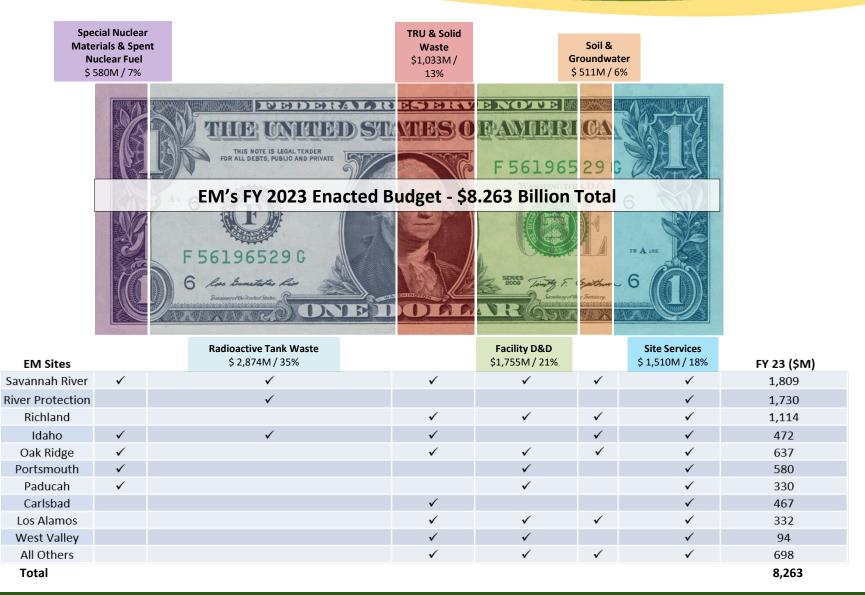

Three Fiscal Year Budget Push: Status

FY 2023 Execution

• Energy and Water Development and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2023 was signed by the President on December 29, 2022

FY 2024 Budget Request

- DOE submitted EM's budget request to Congress on March 13th
- EM-1 and Staff Briefed HEWD and SEWD on March 15th and 16th
- S-1 testifies on the FY2024 budget to HEWD March 23rd, SEWD May 3rd
- EM-5 briefs HASC and SASC Staff on FY2024 budget March 23rd
- EM-1 testifies on FY2024 budget to HASC Strategic Forces Subcommittee in late April

FY 2025 Budget Planning

- Workshop with Field Managers in April 2023
- Briefings to Secretary and CFO Summer 2023

EM's request builds on past investments and supports new innovative initiatives

- Advances commissioning and startup of Direct Feed Low-Activity Waste (DFLAW) and ramps up work at the WTP High-Level Waste Facility at the Office of River Protection in Washington
- Completes K Basin dewatering and maintains key risk reduction activities at Richland in Hanford
- Processes tank waste at Savannah River Site in South Carolina
- Continues infrastructure improvements at the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant (WIPP) to enable increased transuranic waste shipments
- Continues operation of the Integrated Waste Treatment Unit and completes decontamination and demolition of four of seven structures at the Subsurface Disposal Area (SDA) at Idaho
- Continues cleanup of excess facilities at Oak Ridge National Laboratory and Y-12 National Security Complex in Tennessee

FY 2024 Objectives (continued)

EM's FY2024 budget request builds on past investments and supports new innovative initiatives

- Completes 30 shipments of legacy transuranic waste to WIPP and initiates deactivation and decommissioning of NNSA's Ion Beam Facility at Los Alamos National Laboratory in New Mexico
- Continues segmentation and downsizing of C-333 process building converters to advance deactivation; and continues disposition of R-114 Refrigerant at Paducah in Kentucky
- Completes pre-demolition of the X-333 Process Building; continues construction of the On-Site Waste Disposal Facility (CAP-2 project); and continues debris placement and soil excavations as engineered fill in the On-Site Waste Disposal Facility at Portsmouth in Ohio
- Continues demolition of the Main Plant Process Building at the West Valley Demonstration Project in New York
- Completes shipment of approximately 1M tons of uranium mill tailings for disposal at Moab in Utah
- Continues demolition of excess facilities at Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory in California

The FY2024 Budget Request:

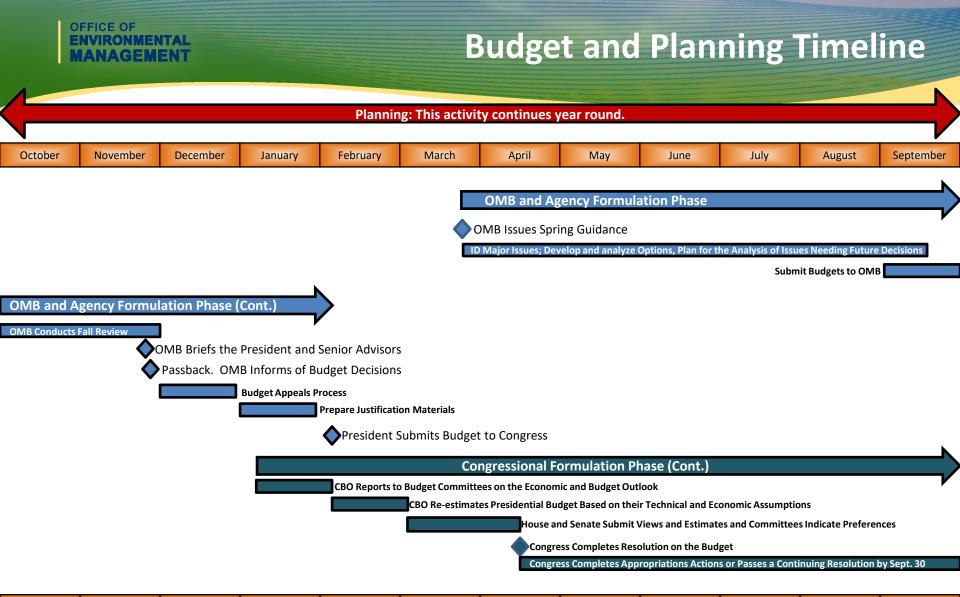
- Invests in underrepresented communities near EM sites to increase engagement and opportunities by expanding the Minority Serving Institutions Partnership Program (MSIPP) consortium that invests in the workforce today and into the future
- Supports Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILT) at impacted communities
- Continues the Community Capacity Building Grant Program to address equity concerns within disadvantaged communities by providing assistance and capacity building based on needs identified through Tribal consultation and stakeholder engagement
- Continues stakeholder outreach on the Justice40 initiative at our Los Alamos Pilot site as well as other EM sites
