Secretary of Energy Advisory Board

What: The Secretary of Energy Advisory Board (SEAB) is an Advisory Committee formed under the Federal Advisory Committee Act (FACA) as amended, 5 U.S.C., App. 2. The SEAB provides advice and recommendations to the Secretary of Energy on the Administration's energy policies, the Department's basic and applied research and development activities, economic and national security policy, and on any other activities and operations of the Department of Energy, as the Secretary may direct.

Who: Member appointment terms are for up to two years and members may be appointed for additional terms. Board members are appointed by the Secretary of Energy.

The SEAB is currently made up of a diverse group of experts from outside the Department of Energy including former DOE officials and pioneering thought leaders such as the first African American graduate of MIT, world renowned nuclear experts, and a "Wind Energy Person of the Year". The SEAB members represent academic institutions, labor unions, utility companies, energy equipment manufacturers, low-income consumers, and non-governmental organizations.

Why: The SEAB provides advice and recommendations to the Secretary of Energy on the Administration's energy policies, the Department's basic and applied research and development activities, economic and national security policy, and on any other activities and operations of the Department of Energy, as the Secretary may direct. The duties of the Board are solely advisory.
