DOE MPP Overview

Program started in 1999 to provide SB's opportunities to receive developmental and technical assistance.

- Spirit of the DOE MPP:
 - provide assistance to SB types that demonstrate a need for assistance
 - equip participants with skills and experiences to successfully compete & perform on both DOE prime contracts and/or subcontracts
- Developmental Assistance
 - Business management guidance
 - Engineering and technical experience
 - Subcontract experience



DOE MPP Overview (cont.)

- Approximately 40 active agreements and 20 mentors that are participating
- Eligibility for DOE MPP participation (Mentor and Protégé)
- Approval Process Contracting Officer concurs on all Mentor-Protégé Agreements (MPA's) OSDBU approves
- Agreement Period 2 years with possibility to extend up to 3 additional years
- Must have a willing mentor before applying
- DOE is considering modifying the program to refine protégé eligibility
 - Focused on the Socio Economics
- OSDBU has developed a workgroup to enhance opportunities through MPP, to increase its supplier base and expand equity among all SB types.



DOE & SBA MPP - Major Differences of Programs

	DOE MPP		SBA MPP
•	Based on an active DOE prime contract.	•	Not based on an active agency prime contract.
•	DOE's Program is specific to DOE, its procurement processes, & mission.	•	Not agency specific (but MPA may be tailored to a specific agency)
•	Development activities – similar	٠	Development activities – similar
•	Subcontracting may occur - possible non-competitive awards	•	Subcontracting may occur as part of development
•	May form a Joint Venture together - affiliation not waived	٠	May form a Joint Venture together - affiliation waived – propose on set asides (as small)



Summary

- The Mentor-Protégé Programs (both DOE and SBA) as well as all of the Federal MPP programs) that can be used as a tool to expand and diversify the DOE supplier base.
- The MPP helps cultivate long-term relationships between Mentors and Protégés, as well as the DOE, that may extend well beyond the program agreement periods.
