

MENTORSHIP FOR ENVIRONMENTAL SCHOLARS PROGRAM

APPLICATION DEADLINE: JAN. 10, 2024

The MES program is a 10-week paid summer internship that introduces underrepresented college students to research opportunities in the environmental science, environmental justice, and environmental policy fields. The MES program actively recruits qualified undergraduates from historically black colleges, tribal colleges and universities, Hispanic-serving institutions, and other minority-serving institutions to receive extensive training that directs them toward gainful employment in various research and management positions within the U.S. Department of Energy.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

- All U.S. citizens (including residents of Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, and other U.S. territories).
- Applicants must be undergraduates attending an accredited MSI recognized by the U.S. Department of Education and be a member of an underrepresented group (including ethnic and racial minorities and persons with disabilities).
- Applicants must be pursuing a degree in science, technology, engineering, math, or STEM-related field (e.g., chemistry, computer science, environmental science, biology).

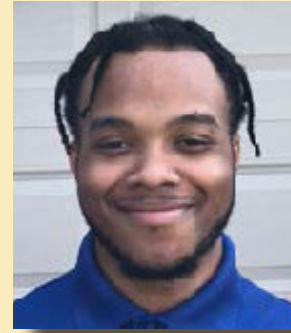
WHY GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO?

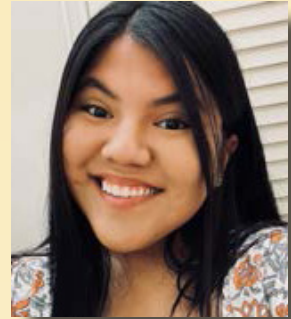
