




Dive into strategies on creating a healthier indoor environment during wildfire season



Though there is no holistic healthy home program on the market today, the International WELL Building Institute's (IWBI) Eric Sun covered the WELL for residential program, an evidence-based third-party verified framework for builders, developers, and operators to create healthier, more resilient homes. Sun also discussed the WELL residential advisory, launched in 2021, that is bringing together industry experts to work, develop, and scale equitable strategies to address health and safety in the home.

Justin Margolies, Senior Product Developer at Slipstream, walked through the history of heat pump installation and evolution of the market today in the upper Midwest. Margolies emphasized that third-party stakeholders can help fill contractor education gaps and empower customers in their decisions and discussed trends to monitor, including connected heat pumps (fault detection and diagnosis and demand response), electrification service providers, and refrigerant scarcity and cost.
