Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to Johns Hopkins University (JHU) to evaluate the lifecycle emissions, economic implications, and optimal dispatch of battery energy storage system (BESS) equipment and associated technologies.

Award activities would consist of only desktop intellectual, academic, and analytical activities, which would take place at JHU (Baltimore, MD), Columbia University (New York, NY), and the National Renewable Energy Laboratory (Golden, CO). The proposed award activities would include lifecycle carbon emission assessments and modeling, BESS dispatch analysis and modeling, and industry engagement with stakeholders. Due to the desktop nature of the award activities, there would be no anticipated hazards associated with the activities.

Any work proposed to be conducted at a federal facility may be subject to additional NEPA review by the cognizant federal official and must meet the applicable health and safety requirements of the facility.

The proposed action has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.
