INTRODUCTION

This cultural resources background review memorandum was conducted for the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE), National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA), Kansas City National Security Campus (KCNSC) Kansas City Non-Nuclear Component Expansion Transformation (KCNExT) (Project Area) to support development of an Environmental Assessment (EA). The Project Area is in the southern portion of Section 26, Township 47N and Range 33W, adjacent to the existing KCNSC Botts Campus in Kansas City, Missouri (MO-150 and Botts Road). This memorandum provides a summary of historical and archaeological resources known to exist within a 1-mile buffer around the Project Area (Study Area) to provide context for the types of resources that have been previously found in the area and the archaeological potential of the Project Area. This preliminary review includes archaeological and historical databases housed by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) and the State Historical Society of Missouri.

- Aerial photography from 1948 to the present (GoogleEarth 2023; NetrOnline 2023).
- USGS Historical Topographic Map Explorer (https://livingatlas.arcgis.com/topoexplorer/index.html)
- The State Historical Society of Missouri's County plat atlases and books (Plat Maps of Missouri Digital Collections (shsmo.org)

RESULTS

Based on a desktop review using the MDNR Archaeological Viewer, one prehistoric lithic scatter archaeological site (23JA1845) has been recorded within the southeastern portion of the Project Area. James Roberts with the Missouri Archaeological Society recorded the site in 1990 and completed the site form for the Project in 2020. This site assemblage included a "grab sample" of lithic items including 7 fragments of shatter, 1 drill, 3 scrapers, and 1 utilized flake. The items were recovered and collected (private collection) during a pedestrian survey for construction or renovations apparently related to a former UMB Bank (constructed in the mid-1980s and removed in 2000). No further information could be gleaned about the site from the site form.

Within the Study Area, there are four additional previously recorded sites (23JA575, 23JA517, 23JA263, and 23JA227). In total, 20 cultural resources surveys have been completed within the 1-mile buffer of the Project Area. Three of the surveys intersect with the Project Area (CS-31, JA-383, JA-853) (Tables 1 and 2; Figure 2). A **Bold** entry in the tables denote surveys within the Project Area.


Based on review of the available county and GLO plat maps, historic topographic maps and aerials, the Project Area has not contained any farmsteads or homesteads since the 1840s. In addition, there are no NRHP-listed historic properties within the Study Area.


SUMMARY AND RECOMENDATIONS

Based on the results of the cultural resources data review, one prehistoric lithic scatter (23JA1845) has been recorded within the southeastern portion of the Project Area. This site is unevaluated for eligibility for NRHP listing. It is recommended that this site either be evaluated through additional fieldwork and documentation or avoided. The entire Project Area was surveyed in 2021 (JA-853) and portions of the Project Area were surveyed in 2006 (JA-383) and 1996 (CS-31). The previously conducted surveys were all negative for cultural resources. Therefore, the Project Area has a low potential to contain archaeological resources and does not contain built resources requiring NRHP assessment. If site 23JA1845 can be avoided or it is assessed as ineligible for NRHP inclusion by DOE and / or MO SHPO, it is recommended that the Project would have no effect on historic (NRHP-listed or eligible) properties as currently designed, and no further archaeological investigations are recommended.
