Proposed Action Title: Chilldyne, Inc. -- Helical Turbulator for Robust Cold Plate

Proposed Action Description:

AMENDED NEPA DETERMINATION: (See attached original Determination, dated April 20, 2022). This Amended Determination follows the approval of additional funds, period of performance, additional project milestones, and a change of performers to support the project team's small-scale research and development activities of a high-performance cold plate with a helical turbulator that increases the heat transfer rate by a factor of 3. Specifically, the project team continue testing the cooling system at increased scale to validate and confirm capabilities. If successful, the end product will cool the high-power CPUs and GPUs of the future, including hyperscale, cloud, and colocation data centers which represent 2/3 of global electricity use for data centers.

Project activities will be conducted at existing facilities at Chilldyne, Inc. (Carlsbad, CA) and Texas Advanced Computing Center (Austin, TX) designed for the applicable activities. Project tasks will be conducted in accordance with established safety and materials/waste management protocols and pursuant to applicable Federal, State, and local regulatory requirements. No modifications will be made to existing facilities to accommodate the proposed work.

Proposed Action Description:

Funding will support the project team's small-scale research and development of a high-performance cold plate turbulator that could increase the heat transfer rate of data center chillers by a factor of 3. Specifically, the project team will design and test concept and full scale designs, draft market plans, and develop associated software for a system that will allow data centers with high power processors to operate anywhere with significantly reduced use of energy for cooling. If successful, the end product will provide very low thermal resistance for cooling the high-power CPUs and GPUs of the future, including hyperscale, cloud, and colocation data centers, which represent 2/3 of global electricity use for data centers.

Project activities will be conducted at existing facilities at Chilldyne, Inc. (Carlsbad, CA) and Sandia National Laboratories (Albuquerque, NM), designed for the applicable activities. Project tasks will be conducted in accordance with established safety and materials/waste management protocols and pursuant to applicable Federal, State, and local regulatory requirements. No modifications will be made to existing facilities to accommodate the proposed work.
