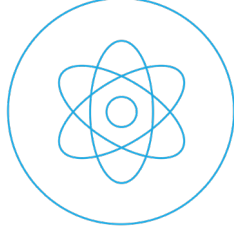
Overview Information

 - other natural disasters that are exacerbated by the climate crisis.

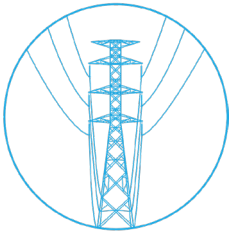

 - Federally recognized Indian Tribes, including Alaska Native Regional Corporations and Alaska Native Village Corporations



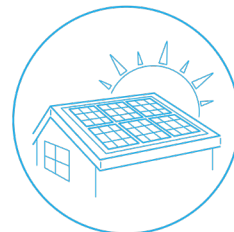
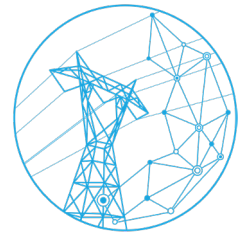

Points of Contact

For your application, you will need to identify the:

- ▶ Sole authorized applicant on behalf of the State or Indian Tribe
- ▶ Principal Investigator/Technical Project Manager
- ▶ Business Point of Contact



Tribal Consortium Applications & Third-Party Agents

If your Tribe is interested in joining a tribal consortium

- ▶ Identify the lead Indian Tribe that will apply on behalf of the Tribal Consortium. They will need to identify the points of contact.
- ▶ *Note: Tribal Consortium applications were added in Amendment 7 of the ALRD.*

If your Tribe is interested in having a third-party representative

- ▶ Identify the third-party agent that will represent the Tribe or the Tribal Consortium.





Grid Resilience State and Tribal Formula Grant: Registration and Pre-Application Requirements

Registration and Pre-Application Requirements

There are several one-time actions that must be completed before submitting an application in response to this ALRD:

- Register with System for Award Management (SAM)
- Obtain a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)
- Register with FedConnect



Registration and Pre-Application Requirements

System for Award Management (SAM.gov)

Applicants must register with the SAM at <https://www.sam.gov> prior to submitting an application in response to this ALRD.

- Designating an Electronic Business Point of Contact (EBiz POC) and obtaining a special password called an MPIN are important steps in SAM registration.
- The applicant must maintain an active SAM.gov registration with current information at all times during which they have an active Federal award or an application under consideration.
- It may take up to two weeks to register with SAM.



Registration and Pre-Application Requirements

Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)

- ▶ Applicants must obtain an UEI from the SAM to uniquely identify the entity. The UEI is available in the SAM entity registration record.
- ▶ Obtaining a UEI may take one day after entering the EBiz POC name and email in SAM.
- ▶ *(The UEI replaces the DUNS number that was previously required for Federal grants)*



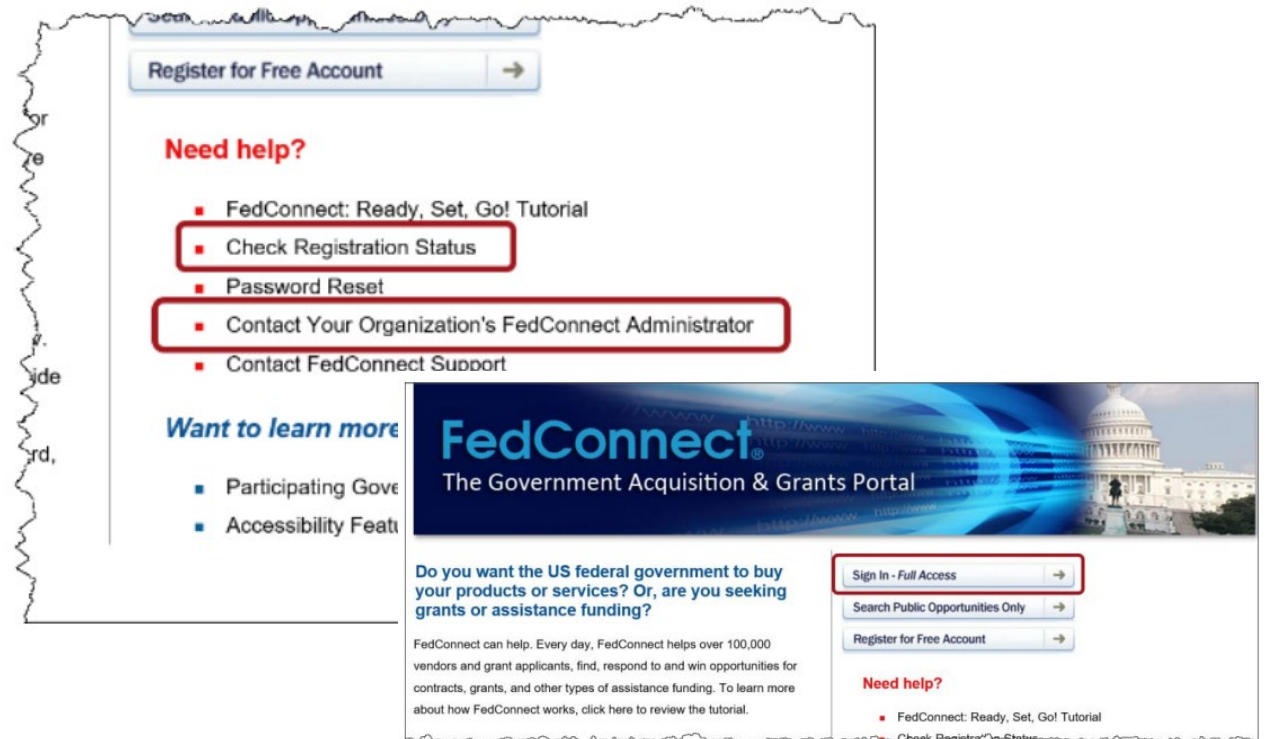

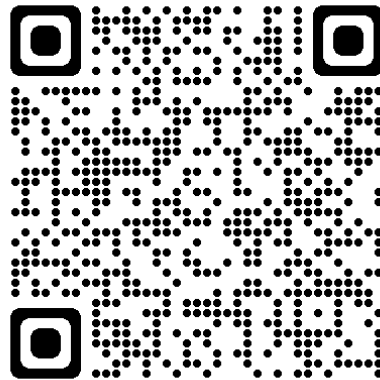

Grid Resilience State And Tribal Formula Grant

New Notice of Intent (December 14, 2023): DE-FOA-00003221 was issued. The link to the NOI is [here](#). The Department of Energy expects to open the FY 24 Grid Resilience State and Tribal Formula Grants application and allocation request period in January 2024. The application period will open with the issuance of an amended Administrative Legal Requirements Document providing instructions for FY 24 grant allocation requests. The FY 24 grant allocations for each state, Indian tribe, and territory can be viewed [here](#). Neither applications nor allocation requests are being accepted at this time.

Amendment 007 of ALRD DE-FOA-0002736 (BIL – PREVENTING OUTAGES AND ENHANCING THE RESILIENCE OF THE ELECTRIC GRID FORMULA GRANTS TO STATES AND INDIAN TRIBES) was issued on June 21, 2023. The link to ALRD Amendment 007 (FedConnect) is below. Amendment 007 allows Indian tribes to submit applications via Tribal Consortium. The submission deadline for Indian tribes remains August 31, 2023. These and other administrative changes are summarized on pages 2-3 of ALRD Amendment 007.

Managed by the U.S. Department of Energy's Grid Deployment Office and supported by the [Bipartisan Infrastructure Law \(BIL\)](#), the Grid Resilience State and Tribal Formula Grants provide non-competitive funding to states (including U.S. Territories) and Indian tribes to improve the resilience of their electric grids. Administered by the National Energy Technology Laboratory and falling under BIL provision 40101(d), the program is designed to strengthen and modernize America's power grid against wildfires, extreme weather, and other natural disasters that are exacerbated by the climate crisis.

The program will distribute funding to states, territories, and federally recognized Indian tribes, including Alaska Native Regional Corporations and Alaska Native Village Corporations, over five years based on a formula that includes factors such as population size, land area, probability and severity of disruptive events, and a locality's historical expenditures on mitigation efforts. The states, territories, and Indian tribes will then award these funds to a diverse set of projects, with priority given to efforts that generate the greatest community benefit providing clean, affordable, and reliable energy.

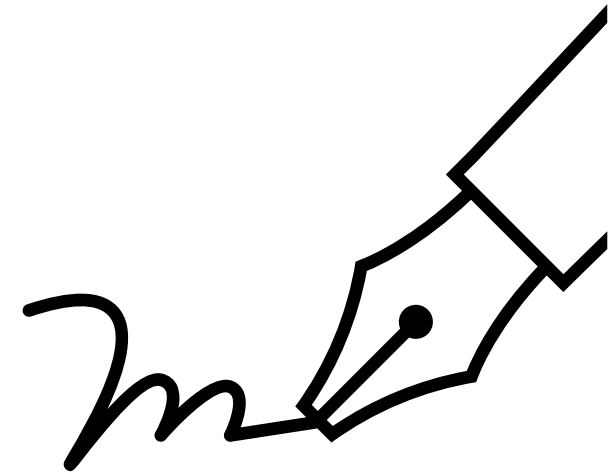

- ▶ GDO encourages applicants to describe the strategy and process for selecting and developing grid resilience projects in the application.
- ▶ Should be around 5 to 15 pages, depending upon the grant amount (allocation) and complexity of program.
- ▶ Sample Program Narrative is available on NETL website. If relevant, sections from the sample document can be directly used in applications.
- ▶ Save the information in a single file named (APPLICANT NAME PROGRAM NARRATIVE.pdf). Example: *Wyoming Program Narrative.pdf*

Program Narrative

1. Objectives and Metrics:

The Tribal Council, in consultation with its members, has established the following objectives and supporting metrics to guide decisions involving resilience investments made in conjunction with this grant.

Objective #1: Ensure that critical community facilities serving the Tribe's members are not impacted by events such as extreme weather conditions, fire or other events causing disruption to normal grid operations. Critical facilities include rural health care facilities, nursing home, dialysis center and community buildings.

Metrics (Provisional):

- Frequency (occurrences per year) of electricity service disruptions of one hour or more to critical facilities
- Number of hours/days critical facilities are closed due to lack of electricity
- Number of workers trained to operate and maintain the resilience project once completed

Objective #2: Address energy burden experienced by low-income Tribe members and disadvantaged Tribal communities that experience frequent disruptions to electricity service

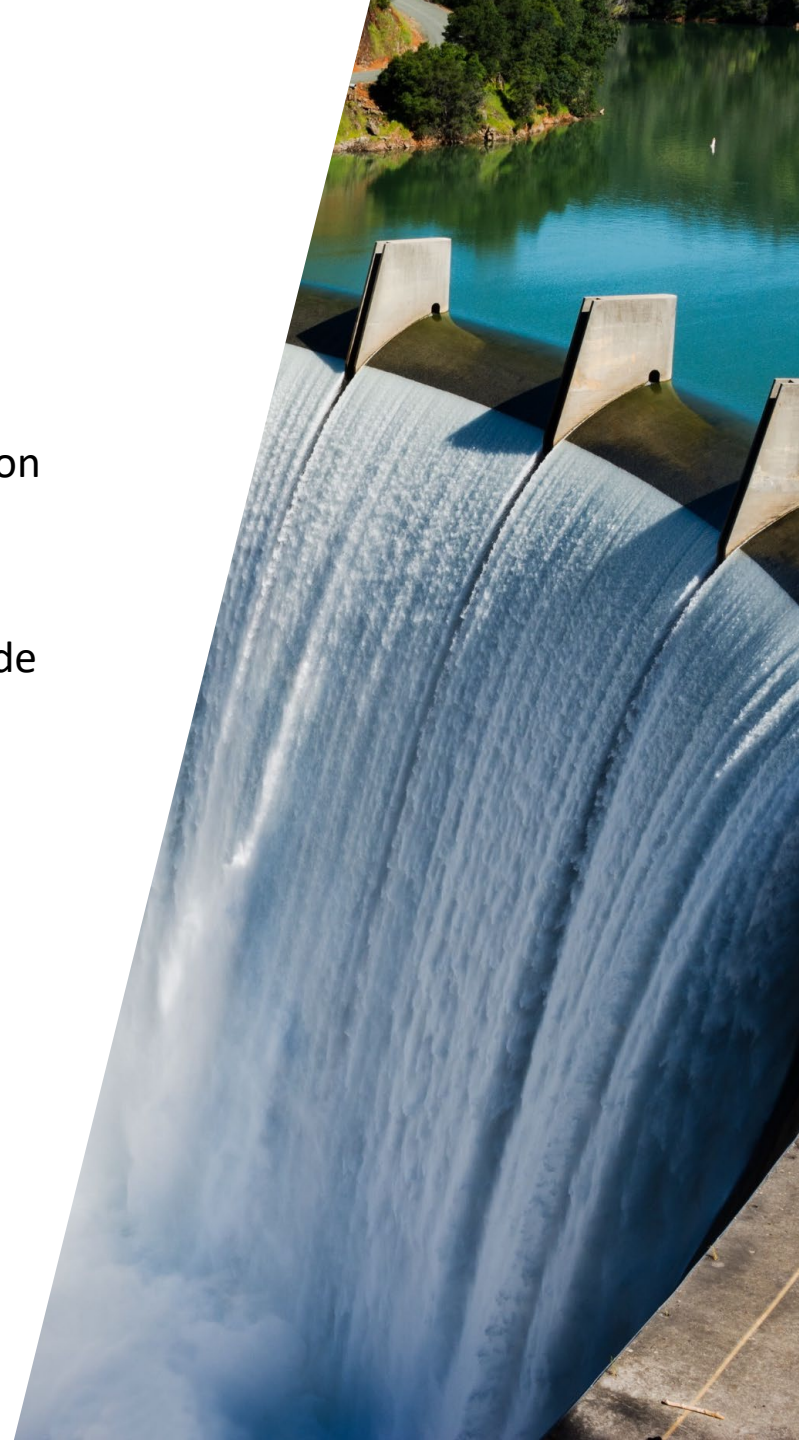

After Submission



- ▶ NETL will reach out to applicants if there are errors or missing information in the submission
- ▶ Grant recipients may, at any time after they receive the grant, provide notification and documentation to DOE for resilience projects and subawards. This process is described in **ALRD Section V.G – Resilience Project and Subaward/Subcontract Notification**.
 - Be aware that review of the documentation and required written concurrence by DOE may take considerable time and will be impacted by factors such as National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) considerations. Please allow sufficient time for this process from when you provide the required information to DOE.

Definitions

- ▶ **ALRD - Administrative Legal Requirements Document** – The guidance document that lists the requirements of the grant.
- ▶ **Authorized Representative/Authorized Official** - The Authorized Representative or Authorized Official is the person with the official & documented authority to certify information and sign official documents, such as grant applications, on behalf of the applying entity.
- ▶ **Principal Investigator/Technical Project Manager** - The Principal Investigator should be the applicant's technical project manager for the projects & technical activities performed under the grant and is responsible for reporting on all technical aspects of the work being performed.
- ▶ **Business Point of Contact** - The Business Point of Contact should be the person who will be responsible for administering the financial aspects of the grant and completing and certifying financial reporting requirements.
