Re: Interconnection Request for the Wibaux Wind Project in Wibaux County, MT

Dear Tribal Leader:

The Western Area Power Administration (WAPA), Upper Great Plains Region (UGP), a power marketing agency with the U.S. Department of Energy, has received a request for the interconnection of Wibaux Wind LLC's proposed "Wibaux Wind Project" (Project) to WAPA's Mingusville 230-kV substation. The proposed Project area is approximately one mile west of the town of Wibaux, SD (see enclosed preliminary maps), and encompasses approximately 30,037 acres (see attached legal descriptions), though only a small fraction of that area would be subject to ground disturbing construction activities. The Project would consist of between 40-70 wind turbine generators and up to 50-MWs of battery storage. Support facilities include underground electric power collection/communication cables, a substation, meteorological towers, access roads, an operations and maintenance facility, and a transmission line. All infrastructure will be located on private land.

WAPA defines the federal undertaking as the interconnection of the Project with WAPA's existing substation. WAPA defines the Area of Potential Effect (APE) as the areas that could experience ground disturbance and/or visual and auditory effects resulting from the construction and operation of the Project.

With this letter, WAPA is inviting Tribes that may attach religious and cultural significance to historic properties within or adjacent to the proposed Project area to participate in the consultation process under Section 106 of the NHPA and its implementing regulation (36 CFR Part 800).

As part of WAPA's historic property identification efforts, we are also seeking general information from you regarding the presence of properties of traditional religious and cultural importance (PTRCI) within the Project footprint. In addition, WAPA is also requesting general information on possible visual or audible impacts from this Project to known PTRCI adjacent to the project area.




