## General Comment

I write this comment in support of Delfin's project to export LNG and hope you will consider all evidence in favor of extending Delfin's license to export.

Delfin has gone through tumultuous ups and downs since its approval of its export license in 2017. Unfortunately circumstances beyond its control such as COVID-19 in 2020 placed a heavy burden on Delfin to meet its export commencement deadline of June 1st, 2024. None the less in the previous 4 years Delfin has shown tremendous progress towards their goal which includes completion of their FEED for their 1st Vessel, multiple signed SPA's with major corporations, and a signed partnership to accelerate the development of its FLNG to name a few.

In addition, the Russian attack on Ukraine in 2022 shows how important American LNG is and will be to our European Allies.
