EM has a long history of support to the DOE Small Business Program and a strong commitment to increasing small business awards to prime contractors and subcontractors to perform EM mission-critical work.

Opportunities with EM

There are many ways to do business with EM, including but not limited to:

Prime Contracts

- Large and small business primes for a wide range of services to include site cleanup/remediation contracts
- Use of set-aside and socio-economic programs
- IDIQs and BOAs (including the End State Contracting Model)
- GSA schedules

Subcontracts

- Teaming subcontractors
- Post-award subcontracts (large and small business, including socio-economic)
- Strategic sourcing, including Supply Chain Management Center and Integrated Contractor Purchasing Team
- Mentor-Protégé Program

Increasing Small Business Participation

Direct prime contracts

- Use of set-aside and/or socio-economic programs
- Contracts to 8as, Indian country, and ANCs
- Process generally begins with RFI (e.g., recent RFI for Bettis adjacent property development)

Subcontracting

- Mandated goals in large business contracts
- Hold contractors accountable for performance
- Meaningful work

Mentor-Protégé program

- SBA program and/or DOE program
- Major RFPs/contracts require agreement(s)
- Mentors provide technical assistance, business development, planning, strategy, guidance

Strategic Sourcing

- Supply Chain Management Center and Integrated Contractor Purchasing Team
- Self-identify as potential supplier; small business credit
- Metrics contribute toward category management achievement

Procurement Equity

OMB Memo M-22-03, Advancing Equity in Federal Procurement:

- Increased focus on Small Disadvantaged Business (SDB) goals
- Increase spending for other socioeconomic small businesses/traditionally underserved businesses
- Increase small business supplier base, including expanded outreach and engagement

Preference to set-aside for small business (including socioeconomic set-asides) wherever possible

- If not, include substantive subcontracting requirements, including socioeconomic categories

Small Business Inclusion

Small Business Clauses and Provisions in Major EM Contracts

- Section H, Subcontracted Work
- Section B, Small Business Subcontracting Fee Reduction Clause
- Sections L/M, Small Business Participation
- Teaming Subcontractors (Not subject to post-award subcontract consent)
- Mentor-protégé agreements
- Sections C/L/M, Improvements to work processes, procedures, and technologies throughout the contract/ordering period
 - *EM is interested in input from industry regarding ideas for further gains in small business inclusion at the prime and subcontract level*

Supply Chain Management Center (SCMC)

Key Features

- DOE Goal of **4% Cost Savings** annually through Strategic Sourcing.
- NNSA holds a contract with the **SCMC** for strategic cost savings.
- EM partners with NNSA to utilize the contract.
- SCMC offers Cost Saving Agreements to EM Prime Contractors in the areas of **Information Technology, Operating Supplies, and Professional Services**.
- Currently over 100 agreements, a majority of which are held by small businesses.
- Agreements meet applicable requirements of **DOE Policy Flash 2014-18**, more commonly known as the “**Golden Ticket**”.
- Greater availability of services through SCMC in recent years, which more closely aligns with EM mission.
- Compliance with FITARA requirements for IT services.
- Future business opportunities are posted on the SCMC website: thescmcgroup.energy.gov
- Contractors complete a supplier profile to be considered for future opportunities.
- SCMC uses the data to select suppliers to best serve EM Prime Contractors.

1. Make sure you are registered on SAM.gov

- And make sure your registration is updated!

2. Do you qualify for a socioeconomic designation? Seek certification if so.

- SDB/8(a), WOSB, SDVOSB, HUBZone.

3. Reach out to those who can help you.

- Detailed questions are best.

4. Use your free resources.

- You do not have to pay for guidance on registering on SAM or getting small business/socioeconomic certifications.
- Contact the SBA, local APEX Accelerators, and federal Small Business Program Managers before hiring a consultant if you need help.
