The Western Area Power Administration (WAPA), Upper Great Plains Region, a power marketing agency within the U.S. Department of Energy, has received a request for the interconnection of Scout Clean Energy's proposed "Silver Queen Wind Project" to WAPA's Sioux City (Yard 1) – Denison 230kV electrical transmission line. The proposed project area is approximately 13 miles east of Denison, IA, in Carroll and Crawford Counties (see enclosed preliminary maps). The proposed Project area encompasses approximately 31,125 acres, though only a small fraction of that area would be subject to ground disturbing construction activities. The Project includes approximately 76 wind turbines. Support facilities would include underground electric power collection/communication cables, a substation, temporary meteorological towers, access roads, an operations and maintenance building, and a transmission line. All infrastructure will be located on private land.

With this letter, WAPA is initiating consultation with the South Dakota State Historic Preservation Officer, per Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act and its implementing regulation (36 CFR Part 800). WAPA defines the undertaking as the proposed interconnection of the Project with WAPA's existing transmission line. WAPA defines the Area of Potential Effect (APE) as the areas that could experience effects from construction and operation of the Project.

The APE includes areas that could experience ground disturbance resulting from construction and operation of the Project. Proposed cultural resource inventory areas for the ground disturbance portion of the APE are:

DISTURBANCE ACTIVITY	MINIMUM SURVEY AREA
Turbine pads (including alternates)	250 foot radius from center point (~4.5 acres)
Access roads	100 feet wide corridor
Crane paths	100 feet wide corridor
Collector lines	100 feet wide corridor
Substation and/or Switchyard	Actual size plus 200 feet buffer
Laydown Yards/Staging Areas	Actual size
New transmission line right-of-way	125 feet wide corridor
O&M center	Actual size plus 125 feet buffer

The APE also includes areas that could experience visual and auditory effects resulting from operation of the Project. Proposed cultural resource inventory areas for visual and auditory effects portion of the APE are areas

within two miles of each turbine. We request your review and concurrence with the APE as defined, per 36 CFR 800.4(a).

As part of WAPA's efforts to identify cultural resources, we are requesting general information on historic properties in and adjacent to the APE. WAPA has also initiated consultation with Indian tribes with traditional associations to lands within the Project area.





- Additionally, this region of lowa has potential for significant archaeological sites with numerous previously recorded sites within the APE. Additionally, there is very little survey work in the area so we are unclear what might exist but has not yet been recorded. We recommend a Phase I archaeological survey of all proposed earthmoving, construction, staging, and access routes in accordance with Association of Iowa Archaeologists guidelines.




