Attachment A

Lakes Road comprises of an approximately 1.25-mile, unimproved one-lane gravel road that extends from Rock Springs Road (County Road 85) to the West Valley Demonstration Project (WVDP) Dam System. The proposed roadway enhancements will be made in the area adjacent to the north of Lakes 1 and 2, and primarily focus on widening the road base in sections where the existing road has poor drainage and is prone to rutting (specifically between Lakes 1 and 2). For this work, approximately 450 linear feet along the road (or 0.03 acres of a linear ditch located on the north side of Lakes Road) will be filled in, and a swale constructed to the east of its existing location, to convey stormwater. As the ditch is a federally jurisdictional wetland, correspondence with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) was necessary; however, as the impact will be less than a tenth of an acre, the USACE confirmed that permitting and preconstruction notification for this work is not required.

Additional scope for the replacement of an existing steel culvert/drainage pipe that lies beneath a portion of School House Road, located to the east of Rock Springs Road is also necessary. As the culvert is associated with a wetland that is regulated under the Freshwater Wetlands Act of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, a 401 Water Quality Certification is necessary. This culvert connects New York State Department of Environmental Conservation regulated wetlands, referred to as Wetland "W14" to the north of School House Road, and Wetland "W18" to the south. Over time, this culvert has deteriorated to the point of failure, as it no longer effectively conveys surface waters and poses a safety risk to personnel and vehicular traffic. In anticipation of the upcoming and proposed enhancements of the Lake 1 Spillway and associated roadway work, it is necessary for this culvert to be replaced. The existing steel pipe will be removed and a 30+/- linear foot, dual wall drainage pipe (with a 24-inch diameter) will be installed in its place, with the addition of flared end sections, approved geotextile fabric, riprap, and crushed stone, as specified in the Replacement of School House Road Culvert Plan and Details (Sketch Number 913-S-0350). This additional scope remains within the general routine maintenance categorical exclusion, provided via 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D, Appendix B, B1.3, "Routine Maintenance," and as covered under "culvert repairs" of the WVDP-specific "Site-Wide Routine Maintenance Activities" Categorical Exclusion (CX-021822). Currently, no other environmental regulatory permits (Clean Water Act or State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System) are required, based on the scope of activities discussed herein.
