Title 2 2024 Revisions

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) recently revised the [Title 2](#) "OMB Guidance for Federal Financial Assistance," which updated parts 1, 25, 170, 175, 180, 182, 183, and 184, including [Part 200 Uniform Requirements \(2 CFR 200\)](#). These updates became effective for all awards beginning October 1, 2024.

Please read the attached notification memo signed by the Head of Contracting Activity (HCA) and the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) to understand potential impacts to your award. You are encouraged to familiarize yourself with these regulatory changes. Award specific questions should be sent to your Project Officer.

Important Reminder: *SEP Annual and SEP BIL funds should not be used to fund administration costs for other Federal programs. Furthermore, funding from one BIL program should not be used to supplement administrative costs associated with another BIL program. States should avoid commingling whereby it is not possible to identify which Federal funding source accomplished which portion of work. It is allowable if the purpose is to achieve reasonable coordination between grant activities, but it is not allowable if the purpose is to cover administrative expenses of another grant. This is to support consistent, accurate, and comprehensive tracking and reporting across annual, BIL, and IRA programs.*

Comprehensive Reporting Checklist

We recognize the multiple reporting requirements on your Federal Assistance Reporting Checklists across several DOE programs and want to thank you for your efforts to date.

To support you in meeting reporting requirements for the SEP annual formula, SEP BIL, EERLF BIL, and EECBG BIL grants, we summarized them in the attached Excel workbook. The color-coded spreadsheets within contain comprehensive lists of reports, due dates, and other information that we hope will help you track reporting requirements for the four programs. Having your award Reporting Checklists at hand will help as you use these lists.
