Covered support buildings and structures include, but are not limited to, those for office purposes, parking; cafeteria services; education and training; visitor reception; computer and data processing services; health services or recreation activities; notione maintenance activities; security (such as security posts); fire protection; small-scale fabrication (such as machine shop activities), assembly, and testing of nonnuclear equipment or components; and similar support purposes, but exclude facilities for nuclear weanons activities and waste storage activities, sucrivities covered in B1.10.
