Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Policy 451.1), I have made the following determination:

Description:

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination	Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. B3.6 Small-scale research and development, laboratory operations, and pilot projects	Siting, construction, modification, operation, and decommissioning of facilities for smallscale research and development projects; conventional laboratory operations (such as preparation of chemical standards and sample analysis); and small-scale pilot projects (generally less than 2 years) frequently conducted to verify a concept before demonstration actions, provided that construction or modification would be within or contiguous to a previously disturbed or developed area (where active utilities and currently used roads are readily accessible). Not included in this category are demonstration actions, meaning actions that are undertaken at a scale to show whether a technology would be viable on a larger scale and suitable for commercial deployment.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Wind Energy Technologies Office (WETO) is proposing to issue the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), Provision 41007(b)(2), Wind Turbine Technology Recycling Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO; DE-FOA-0003373). Through this BIL-funded NOFO, DOE via the WETO Program would provide federal funding to accelerate the acceptance of recycling and reuse of wind energy materials. Goals of this funding include reducing or eliminating carbon emissions and other negative resource impacts related to new component manufacturing as well as reducing the dependence of the domestic clean energy economy on internationally sourced materials, including critical materials. The NOFO includes three Topic Areas.

Topic Area 1 – Enabling Sustainable Wind Turbine Components

- Topic Area 2 Enabling Wind Turbine Material Recycling and Reuse Processes
- Topic Area 3 Recycled and Recyclable Material Qualification

DOE has reviewed the descriptions of each Topic Area and concluded that this NEPA Determination (ND) will only apply to awards selected under Topic Area 3. This ND does not apply to Topic Areas 1 and 2. Topic Areas 1 and 2 will be addressed in a separate ND, i.e., GFO-FOA-0003373-001.

Topic Area 3 is seeking applicants that would develop standard methodologies for qualifying and certifying recycled and recyclable materials that would eventually be adopted by the industry to facilitate use of recycled materials in secondary markets. Federal funding provided by DOE to successful applicants would support activities involving R&D in controlled laboratory spaces or dedicated facilities as well as information gathering, data collection, data analysis, and document preparation activities. All facilities being utilized would be preexisting, purpose-built facilities for the type of work to be conducted for this award. Facility modifications or outdoor work would not be required. All awards funded under Topic Area 3 of the NOFO are categorically excluded from further NEPA review as long as the scope of the selected awards remain consistent with the intent of Topic Area 3, as issued.

Award activities would involve typical hazards associated with laboratory work, operation of potentially hazardous equipment, and site-specific environmental hazards. Existing health, safety, and environmental policies and procedures would be followed to mitigate hazards to acceptable levels. Mitigated hazards would pose negligible risks to the public and environment. All activities would comply with existing federal, state, and local laws and regulations.

DOE has considered the scale, duration, and nature of proposed activities to determine potential impacts on resources, including those of an ecological, historical, cultural, and socioeconomic nature. DOE does not anticipate impacts on these resources which would be considered significant or require DOE to consult with other agencies or stakeholders.

Any work proposed to be conducted at a federal facility may be subject to additional NEPA review by the cognizant federal official and must meet the applicable health and safety requirements of the facility.

NEPA PROVISION

DOE has made a conditional NEPA determination.

The NEPA Determination does not apply to the following Topic Area, Budget Periods, and/or tasks:

Topic Areas 1 and 2 of DE-FOA-0003373

Include the following condition in the financial assistance agreement:

NEPA Determination (ND), GFO-FOA-0003373-002, applies to awards selected under Topic Area 3 of Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) DE-FOA-0003373, provided the scope of the selected awards remain consistent with the intent of Topic Area 3 (as issued) and the selected awards adherence to all conditions put forth in the ND. If selected applicants propose to use award funds for activities outside of the scope of the ND, the award must be submitted for individual NEPA review and receive a separate ND before work can start.

All applicable facility permits/authorizations related to the operation of equipment or processes being utilized for award activities must be obtained and up to date prior to award work starting.

All award activities must comply with existing health, safety, and environmental policies and procedures. If currently not in place, selected applicants must ensure these policies and procedures are established prior to award work starting.

The proposed action (or the part of the proposal defined in the Rationale above) fits within a class of actions that is listed in Appendix A or B to 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D. There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposed action that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposed action has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but

cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

A portion of the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review. The NEPA Provision identifies Topic Areas, Budget Periods, tasks, and/or subtasks that are subject to additional NEPA review.
