Proposed Action or Project Description:

LM is proposing to conduct non-remedy-related routine and non-routine activities associated with the maintenance and ongoing management of the Rocky Flats Site, Colorado, that are not included in or not considered to be part of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) remedy. As the long-term custodian of the site, LM would routinely maintain site conditions to support LM's goals of protecting human health and the environment and to sustainably manage and optimize the use of land and assets through administrative, inspection, maintenance, monitoring, and non-routine activities.

LM maintains the Site as part of CERCLA and Resource Conservation and Recovery Act regulations and requirements outlined within the Corrective Action Decision/Record of Decision for the Rocky Flats Plant. As part of LM's mission and other non-remedy-related requirements, LM conducts additional routine and non-routine activities onsite to maintain the protection of human health and the environment.

To fit within the classes of actions listed in 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D, Appendix B, a proposal must be one that would not: (1) threaten a violation of applicable statutory, regulatory, or permit requirements for environment, safety, and health, or similar requirements of DOE or Executive Orders; (2) require siting and construction or major expansion of waste storage, disposal, recovery, or treatment facilities (including incinerators), but the proposal may include categorically excluded waste storage, disposal, recovery, or treatment actions or facilities; (3) disturb hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminants, or CERCLA-excluded petroleum and natural gas products that preexist in the environment such that there would be uncontrolled or unpermitted releases; (4) have the potential to cause significant impacts on environmentally sensitive resources, including, but not limited to, those listed in paragraph B(4) of 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D, Appendix B; (5) involve genetically engineered organisms, synthetic biology, governmentally designated noxious weeds, or invasive species, unless the proposed activity would be contained or confined in a manner designed and operated to prevent unauthorized release into the environment and conducted in accordance with applicable requirements, such as those listed in paragraph B(5) of 10 CFR Part 1021, Subpart D, Appendix B.
