Description:

A9 Information and dissemination

Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, site visits, and gathering, analysis, audits), data analysis (including, but not limited to, computer modeling), document preparation (including, but not limited to, conceptual design, feasibility studies, and analytical energy supply and demand studies), and information dissemination (including, but not limited to, document publication and distribution, and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring. A11 Technical advice and assistance to organizations

Technical advice and planning assistance to international, national, state, and local organizations.

Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide federal funding to the Interstate Renewable Energy Council, Inc. (IREC) to facilitate nationwide interactions among key stakeholders to discuss issues and concerns, learn about changes in codes and standards, and develop consensus recommendations to facilitate timely permitting of safe solar, energy storage, and electric vehicle projects. Project activities would take place over three budget periods. Project meetings would take place virtually or over the phone. Except where replaced by in-person status meetings or demonstrations, project update conferences would be held virtually or by phone approximately monthly (or on an alternate schedule if requested by DOE).

IREC would be responsible for programmatic, technical, and financial program management. Other project partners include International Code Council (Washington, D.C.) and National Association of State Fire Marshalls (Maitland, FL). IREC would coordinate with the DOE Buildings Technologies Office (BTO) on efforts involving the model energy codes, including developing proposals, publishing recommendations, and creating training or website materials. IREC would also make BTO aware of working group feedback related to energy codes.

EERE is aware of the November 12, 2024, decision in Marin Audubon Society v. FAA, No. 23-1067 (D.C. Cir. Nov. 12, 2024). To the extent that a court may conclude that the Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) regulations implementing NEPA are not judicially enforceable or binding on this agency action, EERE has nonetheless elected to follow those regulations at 40 C.F.R. Parts 1500-1508, in addition to DOE's procedures/regulations implementing NEPA at 10 C.F.R. Part 1021, to meet the agency's obligations under NEPA, 42 U.S.C. §§ 4321 et seq.

There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposed action that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposed action has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

The proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
