

Posting of Late-Filed Form Letter Comments

Between approximately June 28, 2024 and July 1, 2024, DOE received over 92 similarly worded emails from individuals expressing their opposition to the pending application to export liquefied natural gas (LNG) filed by Venture Global CP2 LNG, LLC (CP2 LNG) on December 2, 2021, and subsequently supplemented (Docket No. 21-131-LNG). The public comment period for the application closed prior to the submission of these comments, on March 11, 2022.
