Rationale for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is proposing to provide funding to three Community Sparking Investments in Transformative Energy (C-SITE) grantees to conduct outreach, education, training, feasibility studies, planning, design, and construction for multiple proposed energy projects. This funding opportunity would support high-impact municipally- or Tribal-led projects and is funded through the Office of State and Community Energy Programs' Local Government Energy Program. The proposed projects would be completed over two Budget Periods (BP). This NEPA Determination (ND) only applies to Budget Period One (BP1) activities.

Each community addressed in this ND is associated with a separate DOE-funded award as follows: DE-SE0001522 – Orick Community Services District (OCSD) in Orick, CA DE-SE0001529 – Hopi Utilities Corporation (HUC) in Hopi Reservation, AZ DE-SE0001519 – Region Five Development Commission (R5DC) in Staples, MN

Award activities for the OCSD would include community engagement, microgrid design, energy load analysis, procurement, permitting, and regulatory approvals.

Award activities for the HUC would include conducting a feasibility study on current grid infrastructure and water security needs, site selection analysis, evaluating potential renewable energy sources, system design, and regulatory compliance.

Award activities for the R5DC would include planning, creating agreements, contracting, and communications. The DOE will complete the NEPA review for BP2 when sufficient information is available to conduct a meaningful review. Sufficient information would include the engineering/design plans at each proposed award location as well as detailed information such as size, scale, and dimensions of activities and equipment.

Award activities associated with this ND involve information gathering and dissemination, data analysis, document preparation, technical advice and assistance, preliminary engineering, and design. There would be no anticipated hazards associated with this award, all activities would take place at existing, purpose-built facilities that are currently used for the type and scale of activities proposed. No physical modifications to existing facilities, ground disturbance, or changes to the use, mission, or operations of facilities would occur. As such, DOE does not anticipate any impacts to resources of concern due to the proposed BP1 activities. Any changes to project activities are subject to additional NEPA review by DOE and are not authorized for federal funding unless and until the DOE Contracting Officer provides written authorization on those modifications.

EERE is aware of the November 12, 2024, decision in Marin Audubon Society v. FAA, No. 23-1067 (D.C. Cir. Nov. 12,

2024). To the extent that a court may conclude that the Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) regulations implementing NEPA are not judicially enforceable or binding on this agency action, EERE has nonetheless elected to follow those regulations at 40 C.F.R. Parts 1500-1508, in addition to DOE's procedures/regulations implementing NEPA at 10 C.F.R. Part 1021, to meet the agency's obligations under NEPA, 42 U.S.C. §§ 4321 et seq.

FOR CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION DETERMINATIONS

This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

A portion of the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review. The NEPA Provision identifies Topic Areas, Budget Periods, tasks, and/or subtasks that are subject to additional NEPA review.
