**WEATHERIZATION PROGRAM NOTICE 25-2**  
**ISSUED DATE: July 1, 2025**

**SUBJECT:** PROGRAM YEAR (PY) 2025 GRANTEE ALLOCATIONS

**APPLICABLE TO:** Annual Formula Grants

**INTENDED AUDIENCE:** Weatherization Grantee Program Managers, Weatherization Subgrantee Program Managers

**PURPOSE:** To provide Grantee allocations for the preparation and submission of applications for funding of the Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) for PY 2025.

**SCOPE:** The provisions of this guidance apply to all Grantees applying for financial assistance under the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) WAP.

**LEGAL AUTHORITY:** Title IV, Energy Conservation and Production Act (ECPA), as amended, authorizes DOE to administer WAP ([42 U.S.C. § 6861, et. seq.](#)). All grant awards under this Program shall comply with applicable law and regulations including, but not limited to, WAP regulations contained in the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) at [10 CFR 440](#) and Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards at [2 CFR 200](#).

**PROCEDURES:** On March 15, 2025, President Donald J. Trump signed H.R. 1968 the Full-Year Continuing Appropriations and Extensions Act, 2025, which provides Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 full-year appropriations through September 30, 2025. Under this Act, WAP was appropriated \$326,000,000 for the Retrofit program, \$10,000,000 for Headquarters Training & Technical Assistance (T&TA) and \$30,000,000 for Weatherization Readiness Funds (WRF). Total funding received for WAP is \$366,000,000.

DOE will not be reserving funds to implement Enhancement & Innovation and Sustainable Energy Resources for Consumers WAP sub-programs with FY25 funding.

WAP determines annual Grantee allocations in accordance with the formula in [10 CFR 440.10](#) based on the fiscal year budget authorized by Congress. The *Population Factor*, *Climatic Factor*, and *Residential Expenditure* are the factors of this formula.
