General Comment

Dear U.S. Department of Energy,

I am writing to express my strong opposition to the proposed Saguaro LNG project planned for Puerto Libertad, Sonora, Mexico, which seeks to export U.S. natural gas through the Gulf of California.

This project poses a serious and irreversible threat to one of the most biodiverse marine ecosystems in the world. The Gulf of California is home to over one-third of the planet's cetacean species, including endangered whales that rely on these waters for migration, breeding, and feeding. The increase in maritime traffic from LNG tankers would introduce underwater noise pollution, heighten the risk of fatal collisions, and disrupt critical habitats essential for the survival of these marine mammals.

In addition to the direct harm to whales and other marine life, the project undermines global efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and transition to clean energy. Building new fossil fuel infrastructure in the midst of a climate crisis is both irresponsible and short-sighted.

I urge the Department of Energy to deny any authorization that would enable or support the export of gas via the Saguaro LNG facility. The protection of marine biodiversity and the integrity of the Gulf of California must take precedence over short-term economic interests.
