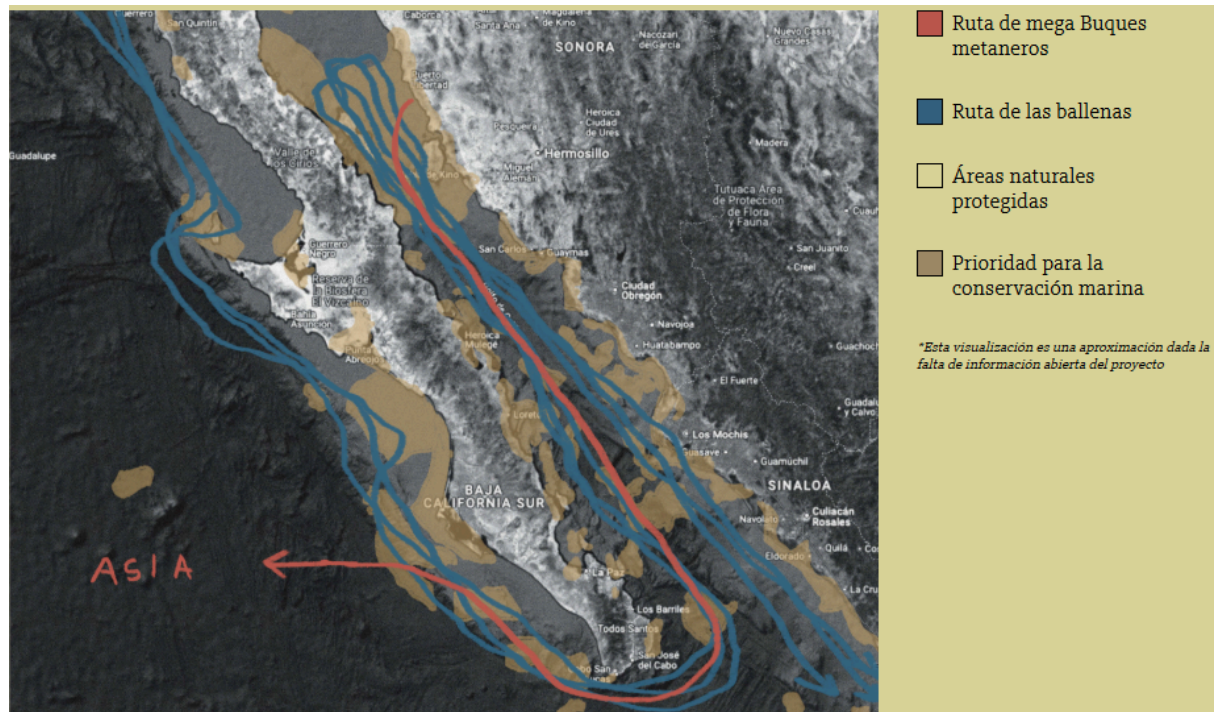


The project endangers the balance of the ecosystem; it would be devastating for hundreds of native species and the dignified future of upcoming generations.



The route planned for the ships to pass through is the same one used by the blue whale. This area is known as the "aquarium of the world" because it serves as a refuge for various marine species. The presence of ships not only causes water pollution but also interferes with the whales' hearing, as the noise from the ships stresses and harms them. Additionally, collisions between ships and whales could severely injure or kill them.



The situation on land is no better. One of the main threatened species is the prairie dog, whose burrows lie directly along the planned path of massive gas pipelines, destroying its habitat. The prairie dog is already a threatened and endangered species, and its well-being must be protected.

The invasion of this space is a threat not only to local wildlife but to the global balance of ecosystems, since many marine species travel and migrate through this area.

This site is also vital for local economic activities such as fishing and tourism, which would also be harmed, reducing opportunities for the people who live there.
