General Comment

I firmly and unequivocally reject the Saguaro LNG Project, as it poses a direct and serious threat to the ecosystem of the Gulf of California, to the human rights of coastal communities, and to life in all its forms.

This project blatantly violates the constitutional right to a healthy environment, enshrined in Article 4 of the Mexican Constitution. It also contradicts the commitments made by Mexico under the Escazú Agreement, which requires states to ensure public participation in environmental decision-making, protect environmental defenders, and apply the precautionary principle—which states that the lack of scientific certainty must not be used as a reason to postpone action when there is a risk of serious or irreversible harm.

The Gulf of California, also known as "the world's aquarium," is not just any location: it is a unique and irreplaceable ecosystem, home to endemic species, a sanctuary for cetaceans, and a vital part of Mexico's ecological and cultural heritage. Its destruction is unjustifiable—economically, ecologically, and morally. Increasing methane and CO₂ emissions, and flooding this area with industrial shipping traffic, is a death sentence for marine biodiversity and for the communities who depend on it.
