## General Comment

As a Mexican citizen, I am against this project being carried out on Mexican soil, as the impact would cause irreparable environmental and social disasters.

The gas pipelines cross two states of the Mexican Republic, where there are grasslands that are home to a large number of species such as prairie dogs. It also crosses the Bavispe protected area in Sonora.

The route for maritime gas transport crosses the Gulf of California, an area known as the world's aquarium due to its abundance of marine fauna. It is also a breeding zone for whales, and the presence of ships puts their lives at risk. This impact comes from ships colliding with whales, the noise generated by their engines preventing communication between them, and water pollution from oil and diesel from the engines.

The presence of ships would also bring more problems to the area with exotic or invasive species transported there by ships in their ballast water.

Local communities near the gas pipelines and liquefaction plant would see their health damaged and be at risk of being displaced. In addition, communities that depend on tourism and fishing would also be affected by this risky practice.
