## Engagement Simulation Systems Support Program



The Office of National Security Assessments, within the Office of Enterprise Assessments, manages and operates the Engagement Simulation Systems (ESS) Support Program. The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) established the ESS Support Program in 1992, and after a training fatality in 1995, DOE recognized the need for a capability to safely replicate weapons and weapons effects requisite with the DOE Design Basis Threat policy. For over 30 years, the ESS Support Program has been the premier DOE tactical exercise simulations organization for ESS training and employment that supports the security of DOE critical assets and national security objectives.
