I am reaching out to highlight the pressing need to reconsider the extension of Mexico Pacific's export permit. The Gulf of California is a critical habitat, home to unique species like the vaquita porpoise, blue whales, and various sea turtles. These creatures depend on an undisturbed environment to survive, and introducing LNG infrastructure poses significant risks to their already fragile existence.

As cleaner energy options become increasingly viable, the responsibility to assess the true public interest of such projects becomes more crucial. The proposed facility would prioritize profits over the well-being of marine ecosystems and communities, imposing long-term ecological and social costs.

In light of these concerns, I strongly recommend rejecting the permit extension to protect our invaluable biodiversity.
