It is crucial for the U.S. Department of Energy to reject the Mexico Pacific Limited's request for an extension of the Saguaro LNG export facility permit.

Protecting American Interests:

- **Economic Concerns**:
- Exporting LNG to Asia diverts essential U.S. gas needed domestically.
- This directly competes with American Gulf Coast facilities, reducing investment in local infrastructure.
- The project reallocates natural gas from the Permian Basin away from U.S. consumers.
- **Energy Security Risks**:
- Prioritizes Mexican exports over U.S. energy autonomy.
- Commits significant U.S. gas reserves to overseas markets, impacting local supply.
- Strengthens international competitors, notably China, at the expense of U.S. strategic interests.

Legal and Environmental Issues:

- Permit modifications were granted in Mexico without necessary environmental assessments.
- Mexican courts have suspended project activities, reflecting ongoing legal disputes over permit legitimacy.
- SEMARNAT has confirmed the absence of environmental authorization, raising further concerns.

Recommended Action:

Denying this permit extension is imperative. The company cannot demonstrate "good cause" under current legal uncertainties in Mexico. Approving this extension undermines U.S. energy priorities and supports a legally questionable project.

Upholding robust American LNG infrastructure on the Gulf Coast should remain the focus, rather than subsidizing developments abroad.
