Dear U.S. Department of Energy,

It is imperative that the extension request for the Saguaro LNG export facility, proposed by Mexico Pacific Limited, be rejected to protect American economic and strategic interests.

Threats to U.S. Economic Stability:

- Exporting LNG to Asia depletes U.S. natural gas reserves, assets crucial for domestic consumption.
- This project competes against Gulf Coast LNG facilities, undermining investments in American energy infrastructure.
- Permian Basin resources are being redirected, compromising U.S. economic benefits.

Compromise of Energy Security:

- Prioritizing Mexican terminals threatens U.S. energy independence and security.
- By committing valuable resources to Asian markets, domestic supply diminishes, benefiting international competitors, especially China.

Serious Legal Concerns in Mexico:

- ASEA's illegal permit modification was done without essential environmental assessments.
- A federal Mexican court has indefinitely suspended project activities since March 2024.
- Current Mexican administration, in March 2025, confirmed no environmental authorization was granted for this project.

Urgent Recommendation:

- Deny the permit extension. Judicial suspensions and legal uncertainties in Mexico highlight there is no "good cause" for this extension.
- Approval would squander U.S. resources, prop up legally questionable projects, and weaken American strategic energy interests.

The United States must prioritize its own LNG capabilities and bolster Gulf Coast infrastructure, rather than supporting foreign endeavors.
