It is intended for use by the procurement professionals of DOE, primarily Contracting and Grants Officers, and other officials of DOE that participate in the acquisition process. Other parties are welcome to its information, but definitive interpretation of its effect on DOE solicitations, Notice of Funding Opportunity Announcements, Awards, and other related procedures and actions may only be made by DOE Contracting and Grants Officers.

When is this Financial Assistance Letter (FAL) Effective?

This FAL is effective upon issuance.

When does the FAL expire?

This FAL supersedes FAL 2022-04 and remains in effect until canceled or superseded.

Who is the intended audience?

Department of Energy (DOE) and National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA) Contracting and Grants Officers. Any reference in this guidance to Contracting Officer (CO) should be understood to include Grants Officer (GO). Any reference in this guidance to the DOE should be understood to include the NNSA, unless otherwise indicated.

What is the purpose of this FAL?

The purpose of this FAL is to provide information and guidance regarding DOE's implementation of the National Science and Technology Council (NSTC) Research Security Subcommittee Common Forms, as it relates to biographical sketches and current and pending support.

What is the background information?

In accordance with Section 4(b)(vi) of National Security Presidential Memorandum-33 (NSPM-33), the NSTC Research Security Subcommittee worked to develop standard forms for disclosures related to potential conflicts of interest and commitment from participants in federally funded research and development (R&D). Consistent with NSPM-33, individuals are required to disclose contracts associated with participation in programs sponsored by foreign governments, instrumentalities, or entities, including foreign government-sponsored talent recruitment programs. On November 1, 2023, the National Science Foundation (NSF), which serves as steward for the standard forms, released the Common Form for Current and Pending (Other) Support Information and the Common Form for Biographical Sketch. These standard forms are intended to replace forms/formats currently used by agencies for the relevant sections of applications, thereby increasing the consistency of disclosure forms and reducing administrative burden.

Consistent with other federal funding agencies such as NSF and National Institutes of Health (NIH), DOE/NNSA will implement the common forms electronically, via the [Science Experts Network Curriculum Vitae \(SciENcv\) system](#).

A. Applicability**1. Common Form for Biographical Sketch:**

The Common Form for Biographical Sketch (“Biosketch”) replaces the Resume requirement in all DOE and NNSA notice of funding opportunities (NOFOs), financial assistance agreements resulting from those NOFOs, congressionally directed spending (CDS) projects, and non-competitive financial assistance agreements that are issued on or after the effective date of this FAL. Partnership Intermediary Agreements (PIAs), Prizes, Technology Investment Agreements (TIAs), and Other Transaction (OT) agreements are not required to use the Biosketch Common Form in place of the Resume requirement.

DOE will implement the Biosketch Common Form in SciENev without change to any collection fields. In the NOFO instructions (see Appendix 1), the DOE/NNSA program offices may:

- a) Specify whether a persistent identifier (PID) is required or not, following the guidance in [FAL 2024-05 Digital Persistent Identifier Requirements for Certain Individuals for Research and Development](#) (i.e., PIDs are required for NOFOs and Awards that encompass R&D activities, or technical assistance to support R&D activities. FAL 2024-05 does not require PIDs for non-R&D activities). Please note, FAL 2024-05 is silent on whether non-competitive R&D projects require PID. For the purposes of the Biosketch and Current and Pending (Other) Support (“CPS”) Common Forms, PIDs are required for non-competitive R&D projects.
- b) Specify the Biosketch reporting timeframe for professional appointments and positions outside of the primary organization (e.g., 3 years, 10 years, or since age 18).
- c) Specify a limit on the number of research products (e.g., publications, patents, datasets, etc.) a covered individual includes on the Biosketch; and/or
- d) List examples of other types of products relevant to the NOFO’s objectives. For example, a NOFO focused on demonstration and commercial application activities may request information on non-research products and activities in the NOFO’s Biosketch instructions.

2. Common Form for Current and Pending (Other) Support:

The CPS Common Form applies to all DOE and NNSA NOFOs, financial assistance agreements resulting from those NOFOs, congressionally directed spending (CDS) projects, and non-competitive financial assistance agreements that are: 1) issued on or after the effective date of this FAL; and 2) encompass research, development, and demonstration (RD&D) activities, or technical assistance to support RD&D activities.

Exclusions from the CPS Common Form include:

- NOFOs and financial assistance agreements with Indian Tribes and Tribal Organizations.
- NOFOs and financial assistance agreements that exclusively fund conferences, workshops, and other technical meetings. Note: A program may choose to require the CPS Common Form in these instances to ensure that a proposed activity is not duplicated and that the personnel have the capacity to take on the proposed work.
- NOFOs and financial assistance agreements that exclusively fund education/outreach projects. Note: A program may choose to require the CPS Common Form in these instances to ensure that a proposed activity is not duplicated and that the personnel have the capacity to take on the proposed work.
- NOFOs and financial assistance agreements that exclusively fund deployment of off-the-shelf products (this includes commercial products)
- State and Community Energy Program (SCEP) Administration and Legal Requirements Documents (ALRDs), SCEP formula awards, and Federal Energy Management Program (FEMP) actions.

DOE/NNSA will implement the CPS Common Form in SciENCv without change to any collection fields. In the NOFO instructions (see Appendix 1), the DOE/NNSA program offices may:

- a) Specify whether a PID is required or not, following the guidance in [FAL 2024-05 Digital Persistent Identifier Requirements for Certain Individuals for Research and Development](#) (i.e., PIDs are required for NOFOs and Awards that encompass R&D activities, or technical assistance to support R&D activities. FAL 2024-05 does not require PIDs for non-R&D activities).
- b) In addition to current support and pending support, also require disclosure of past support “for reasons specified by statute, regulation, specific agency authorities, or other compelling reasons¹”.
- c) Specify what types of activities to disclose on the CPS Common Form in cases where it is used for:
 - Non-R&D NOFOs and awards
 - Covered individuals outside of academia or research-based professions; and/or
- d) Require disclosure of additional information, and/or disclosure from a broader range of participants, either as a matter of course or upon request²:
 - Modify the disclosure requirements for “Travel supported/paid by an external entity to attend a conference or workshop” when the conference/workshop and/or supporting entity is located in a Foreign Country of Concern (FCOC).
 - Require a *Current and Pending (Other) Support Addendum*.

3. Both Common Forms:

If a NOFO permits submission of applications from another federal agency, a federally funded research and development center, or a National Laboratory, those institutions must comply with the same Common Form requirements described above.

As a general rule, other financial assistance vehicles such as Prizes and PIAs, TIAs, and OT agreements are not required to use the Common Forms, but these vehicles may use the forms on a case-by-case basis. The RTES Office will recommend during Phase 1 review of Prizes, PIAs, and OTs whether Common Form requirements may be warranted.

B. Definitions

Covered Individual has the meaning specified in the applicable NOFO/financial assistance agreement. DOE/NNSA's standard definition of covered individual is outlined in [FAL 2025-02 Research Security Training Requirement for all R&D Financial Assistance Awards](#).

Demonstration has the meaning given such term in [2 C.F.R. § 910.130\(e\)](#).

Research and development and **R&D** have the meaning given such terms in [2 C.F.R. §200.1](#).

C. Implementation

DOE will require all covered individuals listed on NOFO applications and financial assistance agreements to prepare their DOE/NNSA Common Forms electronically via SciENcv³. See applicability section above for which types of NOFOs and projects require each Common Form.

When required, NOFO applicants must include Biosketch and CPS Common Form submissions for all covered individuals named in the application. Note that the CPS requirement does not apply to projects that meet the exclusions listed in the Applicability section above.

After selection and during the life of the award:

- If a recipient or subrecipient wishes to add a **new covered individual** to the project, such person(s) must submit the *Biosketch* and *CPS Common Forms* and obtain DOE approval prior to joining the project team. Note that this requirement does not apply to projects that meet the exclusions listed in the Applicability section above.
- For **previously approved covered individuals**, if there are changes to the previously submitted *Biosketch* or *CPS Common Form*, the individuals must update their disclosures within 30 days of the change, or on a timeline consistent with the program office instructions. Note that this requirement does not apply to projects that meet the exclusions listed in the Applicability section above.

To ensure consistency across DOE and NNSA:

- NOFOs must include the language provided in Appendix 1a and Appendix 1b
- Awards must include the language provided in Appendix 2

³ SciENcv is an electronic system developed and maintained by the NIH/National Library of Medicine that helps researchers assemble the professional information needed for participation in federally funded research. SciENcv gathers and compiles information on expertise, employment, education, and professional accomplishments. Researchers can use SciENcv to create and maintain biosketches that are submitted with applications and annual reports. SciENcv allows researchers to describe and highlight their scientific contributions in their own words.

Appendix 1a

Language for Notices of Funding Opportunities (NOFOs)

Biographical Sketch *[Required for all NOFOs]*

As part of the application, each covered individual at the applicant and subrecipient level must submit a biographical sketch (“*Biosketch*”). Use [SciENCv \(Science Experts Network Curriculum Vitae\)](#) to produce a DOE/NNSA compliant PDF version of the *Biosketch*. Note that there is no page limitation for the *Biosketch*, though some fields in SciENCv have character limitations for consistency.

Consistent with the instructions in [NSPM-33 Implementation Guidance Pre- and Post-award Disclosures Relating to the Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending \(Other\) Support](#)⁴ and the **DOE/NNSA NOFO-Specific Biosketch Instructions** below, the *Biosketch* and *CPS Common Forms* must together include a list of all sponsored activities, awards, and appointments, whether paid or unpaid; provided as a gift with terms or conditions or provided as a gift without terms or conditions; full-time, part-time, or voluntary; faculty, visiting, adjunct, or honorary; cash or in-kind; foreign or domestic; governmental or private-sector; directly supporting the individual’s research or indirectly supporting the individual by supporting students, research staff, space, equipment, or other research expenses. All connections with malign foreign talent recruitment programs must be identified.

Appendix 1b

Language for Notices of Funding Opportunities (NOFOs)

Current and Pending (Other) Support

[Required for most NOFOs. See exclusions in the Applicability section above.]

Current and pending (other) support (“*CPS Common Form*”) is used to identify potential duplication, overcommitment, potential conflicts of interest or commitment, and all other sources of support.

As part of the application, each covered individual at the prime applicant and subrecipient level must submit a *CPS Common Form*. Use [SciENcv \(Science Experts Network Curriculum Vitae\)](#) to produce a DOE/NNSA compliant PDF version of the *CPS Common Form*. Note that there is no page limitation for the *CPS Common Form*, though some fields in SciENcv have character limitations for consistency.

Consistent with the instructions in [NSPM-33 Implementation Guidance Pre- and Post-award Disclosures Relating to the Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending \(Other\) Support](#)⁵ and the DOE/NNSA NOFO-Specific CPS Instructions below, the *CPS Common Form* and *Biosketch Common Form* must together include a list of all sponsored activities, awards, and appointments, whether paid or unpaid; provided as a gift with terms or conditions or provided as a gift without terms or conditions; full-time, part-time, or voluntary; faculty, visiting, adjunct, or honorary; cash or in-kind; foreign or domestic; governmental or private-sector; directly supporting the individual’s research or indirectly supporting the individual by supporting students, research staff, space, equipment, or other research expenses. DISCLOSURE REQUIREMENTS

Prior to award, the recipient was required to provide current and pending support disclosure statements (“*CPS Common Form*”) and a Biographical Sketch (“*Biosketch*”) for each covered individual, as defined by the Award Terms and Conditions, at the recipient and subrecipient level, regardless of funding source.

New Covered Individuals:

Before new covered individuals may start work on the project, the recipient must submit *CPS Common Forms* and *Biosketch(es)* for new covered individuals and must receive prior approval from DOE/NNSA. R&D covered individuals must comply with the Digital Persistent Identifier (PID) and Research Security Training Requirements Terms and Conditions.

Changes to Previously Submitted Current and Pending Support Disclosures During the Period of Performance of the Award:

The recipient must ensure that the covered individuals are aware that, should circumstances change which impact the responses previously provided on either the *CPS Common Form* or the *Biosketch*, the individual must submit an updated *CPS Common Form* and/or updated *Biosketch*. The recipient must submit the updated *CPS Common Form(s)* and updated *Biosketch(es)* to DOE/NNSA within thirty (30) calendar days after the end of the quarterly reporting period in which the change occurred. Reporting Timeframe Exception: Adjustments to level of effort on previously reported support that is not FCOC-related may be reported with the next scheduled annual progress report.
