Over the past few years, N3B has engaged in a concerted effort to improve our operational excellence, including:


- Our work in the field

Meeting Our Commitments



Waste Program Success



Completed 43 transuranic (TRU) waste shipments in FY25, an increase of 21 shipments from FY24

Shipped more than 193.4 m^3 of TRU waste to the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant (WIPP), exceeding our FY25 goal by more than three times (62 m^3)



Completed size-reduction activities for 158 retrieved corrugated metal pipes (CMPs) and began shipping CMP waste to WIPP



Dispositioned remaining above-ground low-level and mixed low-level waste containers at Area G

Protecting New Mexico's Environment

Advanced groundwater monitoring and characterization, including:



- Drilled San Ildefonso Mortandad Regional 3 (SIMR-3) well to total depth
- Installed a permanent sampling system in monitoring well R-76
- Completed maintenance on eight regional wells




Collected thousands of soil, water and vapor samples, which is critical for evaluating health risks, environmental impacts, and ensuring compliance with regulatory requirements
