ORDER GRANTING REQUEST TO VACATE LONG-TERM AUTHORIZATION  
TO EXPORT COMPRESSED NATURAL GAS  
TO FREE TRADE AGREEMENT NATIONS

DOE/HGEO ORDER NO. 4616-A

FEBRUARY 10, 2026

On November 2, 2020, the Department of Energy’s (DOE) Office of Fossil Energy (FE) (now the Hydrocarbons and Geothermal Energy Office)<sup>1</sup> issued DOE/FE Order No. 4616<sup>2</sup> to Andalusian Energy, LLC (Andalusian) under section 3(c) of the Natural Gas Act (NGA).<sup>3</sup> Under that order, Andalusian is authorized to export domestically produced compressed natural gas (CNG) in a volume equivalent to 51.14 billion cubic feet (Bcf) per year (Bcf/yr) of natural gas for a term of 25 years. Andalusian is authorized to export the CNG, loaded into International Organization for Standardization (ISO) containers and transported by ocean-going carrier from a proposed CNG compression and container loading facility to be located within the Port of Brownsville, Texas, to countries with which the United States currently has, or in the future will have, a free trade agreement (FTA) requiring national treatment for trade in natural gas.<sup>4</sup>

On December 31, 2025, Andalusian submitted a request asking DOE to vacate Order No. 4616 (Request).<sup>5</sup> In support of this Request, Andalusian states that, “[d]ue to changing market conditions, [it] will not be moving forward with the proposed compression and container loading facility.”<sup>6</sup>

DOE finds good cause to grant Andalusian’s Request. Accordingly, pursuant to NGA

section 3(c), Andalusian's authorization granted in Order No. 4616 is hereby vacated, effective immediately.
