NEI Ellen Ginsberg Carol Berrigan James Glasgow (Pillsbury, Shaw, Pittman, LLC.) The meeting began at approximately 12:30 p.m. and covered the following topics:

- Collection of additional data related to the numbers and types of U.S. suppliers, the level of
 individual supplier involvement, and risks associated with goods and services supplied prior
 to development of a draft rule.
 - Sources of additional data may include the U.S. Department of Energy, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission and the U.S. Department of Commerce.
- DOE engagement of other federal agencies (*e.g.*, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Ex-Im Bank and the U.S. Department of Commerce) to ensure alignment within the federal government on key issues.
- The need for DOE to proceed in a measured and deliberate manner (*e.g.*, collect additional data from public sources, conduct a workshop with stakeholders to obtain additional input and clarity, and publish a draft rule that provides ample opportunity for further comment).
- DOE submittal of an interim report to Congress highlighting the complexity of this issue and the agency's focus on promulgation of an equitable rule.
- The importance of developing an equitable RRPP that does not unreasonably burden domestic suppliers who wish to compete in the global nuclear market.
