IRS regulations require the submission of payment amounts for certain vendors. This information must be submitted to the individuals on Form 1099, and electronically to the IRS.

Failure of an individual to submit a W-9 will result in backup withholding on every payment, per IRS requirements. The IRS requires that this information, located on form W-9, be provided by the individual, and that the subsequent reporting be submitted. Per IRS regulations, if the information provided by the individual is misused, the requester could be subject to civil and criminal penalties.
