

MEMORANDUM OF INTENT CONCERNING
ENERGY CO-OPERATION

The two Governments:


- Recognizing the mutual benefits to be derived from exploiting and using conventional energy sources, including oil, gas, coal and hydroelectric power, in the most efficient ways possible;
- Recognizing the need to develop effective machinery to monitor the environmental effects of energy exploitation, utilization and transportation and the need to develop appropriate environmental standards;
- Recognizing also the need to develop and demonstrate technologies to utilize new and renewable energy sources including the prompt implementation of a solar demonstration project in Nigeria;
- Noting that training in energy planning and technology provides the key to maximizing energy potential, especially in the areas of environmental protection, including the development of appropriate standards; secondary and tertiary oil recovery; deep water and deep onshore drilling techniques; and drilling rig management;

Bearing in mind the desire of both countries to strengthen their bilateral relations through increased official cooperation in the energy areas and through greater cooperation among private sector firms;

Hereby agree to expedite discussions on an Agreement for Energy Cooperation including the further identification of possible areas of cooperation and specific projects. It is intended that a group of Nigerian and U.S. experts will meet as soon as possible after the signing of this Memorandum to discuss such matters and develop specific projects.
