During this revision DOE/EPA addressed other feedback from builders including the garage ventilation provision, which now includes alternative compliance paths. So instead of saying "trust me" - our builders can point to the Indoor airPLUS certification to demonstrate their home's thoughtful, systems-approach to a healthful indoor environment. The "IAP" label on these homes means a 3rd-party certified home which delivers a more comfortable living environment, reduced pollutants, and improved combustion safety.
